

2025 Library Requested Budget Highlights The total 2025 requested budget for HCL is \$79,771,838 The majority of the Library budget consists of staffing costs, followed by technology and collection. These three pillars should continue to make up the majority of the Library budget for the foreseeable future.

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How We Arrived Here • In late April 2024, the County provided instructions on the 2025 budget planning process. Each County department was asked to fit their budget request within a 3% increase in property taxes/operating dollars. • In early May 2024, the Library B&F office began meeting with each section within the Library to review their budget needs for 2025. • This is the first year the Library began using a Zero-Based Budgeting approach. We also asked each section to align their budget priorities with the strategic plan of the Library. • Director Dulimstra was present and participated with B&F in each budget section meeting. • Once finalizing the needs of all 13 budget sections throughout the Library B&F worked with Director Dulimstra to fill in any gaps and right size the entirety of the budget to fit within our total revenue. • Additional "Ballpark funding" made available to us was utilized rather than requiring cuts within specific sections.

The Library requested 2 add-backs to the 2025 budget. Add-backs are essentially items that we cannot fit into the regular budget that we are asking the County to consider providing additional property tax funding for. Our first request was for \$1.58 Million to support 14 additional FTE to expand the Let's Read program. Let's Read provides literacy tutoring serving K-5 ESL students and students that have fallen behind. Our second request was for \$500,000 to support the digital collection and its increasing costs.
