The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNTI

Charge: Murder - 2nd Degree - Without Intent - While Committing a Felony

Minnesota Statute: 609.19.2(1), with reference to: 609.19.2(1)

Maximum Sentence: 40 YEARS

Charge Description: That on or about 8/21/2016, in Hennepin County, Minnesota, Darnell Jerome Davis, did without intent to effect the death of any person, cause the death of the victim, a human being, while committing or attempting to commit the felony offense of Assault in the Third Degree.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Complainant has investigated the facts and circumstances of this offense and believes the following establishes probable cause:

On August 21, 2016 at 9:48 AM, Rogers police and paramedics responded to a residence in Rogers, Hennepin County, Minnesota on a report of an infant who was not breathing. The reporting party was the child's mother, who was at work and had received a call from the child's father, DARNELL JEROME DAVIS, Defendant herein. The child was a five-month-old girl ("the victim") who had been home alone with Defendant since her mother left for work a little before 9:00 AM. Defendant told first-responding officers that he had fed the victim a bottle and later noticed she was not breathing normally.

The victim was transported to Chilidren's Hospital in Minneapolis where she was intubated, treated for seizure-like activity, and received a CT scan. The scan revealed bilateral subdural hemorrhage in the victim's brain. The victim's neurological status continued to deteriorate, and emergency surgery was performed to place an external ventricular drain. The swelling in the victim's brain continued to worsen, despite medical interventions.

On August 23, a pediatric ophthalmologist examined the victim and noted extensive and severe bilateral retinal hemorrhages as well as retinal folds (which are created when the eye is subjected to "tractional forces") in the victim's right eye. A pediatrician specializing in child abuse opined that the victim's "presentation [was] far and away most consistent with abusive head trauma."

Despite a series of life-saving measures, the victim's condition continued to worsen, and life support was removed on August 24. The victim died at 9:11 A.M. on August 25, 2016. She was five months and fifteen days old. By all accounts, the victim was healthy and developmentally on-track prior to August 21, 2016.

Defendant told the child's mother when he first called her that the victim had suffered a seizure. He later denied seizure activity to medical personnel.

Later on August 21, Defendant told a medical provider that he had propped a bottle up for the victim to eat in her bassinet and left her in the bedroom. He said he heard a choking noise and returned to the bedroom and picked up the victim. Defendant said that he ran around the apartment in a panic and hit the victim's head on a doorframe while running. Defendant told a similar account to an investigator. The child abuse pediatrician noted in his report that the victim's injuries were inconsistent with striking her head on a doorframe and that her condition was "most consistent with an acute traumatic incident" that morning.

An autopsy was performed at the Hennepin County Medical Examiner's Office in April 2017. The manner of death was ruled undetermined "due to or as a consequence of...unknown insult." The physical and microscopic findings at autopsy included: subdural hemorrhage, traumatic axonal injury (injury to the nerve fibers in the brain often caused by trauma), a hemorrhage in the victim's cervical spinal cord dorsal nerve root ganglion (located at the very top of the spinal cord, in the neck), and bilateral hemorrhages in the optic nerves and retinas of the eyes. The medical examiner made no findings consistent with an accidental or natural death.

On September 21, 2017, Defendant was interviewed by detectives. He persisted in claiming that he ran around the apartment holding the victim in a panic. When confronted with the medical evidence suggesting that the victim was shaken, he said he may have inadvertently shaken the victim while running.

On April 30, 2018, Defendant met voluntarily with an investigator from the county attorney's office at the

Human Services Building in Buffalo, Minnesota. Defendant initially told the investigator that he picked the victim up after he heard her choking and proceeded to run around in "panic mode," shaking the victim in the process. The investigator confronted Defendant with the medical findings and asked Defendant if he had intentionally caused the victim's injuries. Defendant insisted that he "didn't mean to" hurt the victim.

Defendant then admitted that he was not sleeping well at the time of the victim's death and was taking medicine to help him sleep. Officers at the scene documented a bottle of "Zzzquil" in the kitchen. Defendant told the investigator that, after the victim's mother left for work on August 21, the victim cried for an extended period of time. Defendant admitted that he became frustrated, picked the victim up by her torso, and shook the victim back and forth three or four times. Defendant demonstrated for the investigator how he shook the victim. Defendant confirmed that the victim's head whipped back and forth multiple times when he shook her. After he shook her, the victim was quiet, and he later noticed that she was not breathing and called the victim's mother. Defendant admitted that he had lied to medical staff and investigators previously when he claimed he struck the victim's head while running around in a panic because he did not want anyone to think he was a bad person. Defendant was emotionally distraught throughout the interview. The injuries documented by medical providers and observed at autopsy are consistent with Defendant's confession.

Defendant is not in custody and is believed to be currently staying at his parents' home in Brooklyn Park. Defendant married a new girlfriend approximately six months after the victim died and has a seven-month-old daughter. The State requests this case issue as a warrant. After the recent confession, Defendant is more likely to flee and/or become a danger to himself or others.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:

(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or

(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.

Complainant declares under penalty of perjury that everything stated in this document is true and correct. Minn. Stat. § 358.116; Minn. R. Crim. P. 2.01, subds. 1, 2.
