## SYNOPSIS:

This report pertains to the digitally recorded interview of Crystal Police Sgt. Brandon (DORR) DOB (DORR) DOB (DORR) by Detectives Nybeck and Nelson at the Crystal Police Department located at 4141 Douglas Dr. Crystal, MN on 11-11-2017. DOOR was interviewed by Detectives regarding his actions and knowledge regarding the death of Ronald Lee Klitzka (KLITZKA) DOB 11-20-1954 on 11-10-2017 at 5128 Angeline Ave N Crystal, MN. Refer to all reports and attachments in this case file for greater details.

## NARRATIVE:

On 11-11-17 the above listed Detectives conducted a digitally recorded interview with DORR at the Crystal Police Department. DORR was interviewed regarding his actions and knowledge regarding the death of KLITZKA on 11-10-2017. DORR's interview began at approximately 12:33am and concluded at approximately 12:57am. This report will be a summary of DORR's statements to the Detectives' questions during this interview. The complete interview is saved to this case file as evidentiary value.

DORR stated that he is currently employed by the Crystal Police Department. DORR stated he has been employed by the Crystal Police Department for eight years and as a Sergeant for the last three years. DORR stated that his assigned shift on 11-10-2017 was from 6:30am to 6:30pm and his assigned call number on this date was #3307.

DORR stated that between 5pm and 5:30pm on 11-10-17 he was advised by Hennepin County Sheriff's Office Dispatch that "one is suicidal" at 5128 Angeline Ave. N Crystal, MN. DORR further stated that information was relayed from Dispatch stating that this individual would shoot Police Officers if he encountered them. DORR stated that the this information relayed by Dispatch came from the daughter or step daughter of the suicidal individual at this address. The step daughter is Kari Lynn Snell DOB 9-29-1966 and the suicidal individual was KLITZKA.

DORR stated that upon receiving this information, he requested the assistance of the Robbinsdale and New Hope Police Departments. DORR stated that it is common practice to request the assistance of multiple Police Departments based upon the severity or potential severity of the call. DORR stated that based upon the information provided by Dispatch numerous Officers from both departments responded to the area near this address to provide assistance.

DORR stated that the initial staging area for all responding Police Officers was near the intersection of Angeline Ave N and Quail Ave N. This intersection is approximately one block east of KLITZKA's residence of 5128 Angeline Ave N. DORR stated that Law Enforcement did not initially approach this address based upon information that KLITZKA's wife, Nellie Jean KLITZKA DOB 1-14-1948, may still be present inside this residence and Law Enforcement did not want to create a hostage situation.

DORR stated that the step daughter and KLITZA's wife arrived at the above listed staging location. DORR stated that at this time both individuals informed Law Enforcement of the following: Both females stated that they were "very worried" about KLITZKA. Both females stated that KLITZKA had multiple hand guns inside the residence and that KLITZKA was "saying good bye" to them. Both females stated that KLITZKA was extremely upset regarding the suicide of his brother, Frederick Frank Klitzka DOB 1-8-1960, on 11-6-2017. Both females stated that KLITZKA's brother asked KLITZKA for \$1000 in the preceding week but KLITZKA declined to give his brother this money and blamed himself for his brother's suicide. When asked by Law Enforcement if KLITZKA wanted or was capable for shooting Law Enforcement, KLITZKA's wife stated "its a legitimate possibility".

DORR stated that he, along with the other responding Law Enforcement Officers, received updated and continual information from Dispatch regarding KLITZA. DORR stated that Dispatch advised all Law Enforcement that KLITZKA made statements stating he would kill Law Enforcement if he was approached by them.

DORR stated that after Law Enforcement was initially briefed regarding this situation at the staging location, he directed the responding Law Enforcement Officers to create a soft perimeter around 5128 Angeline Ave N. DORR stated that he directed two Robbinsdale Officers to stage north of this address on 53rd Ave N and two Officers to the south of this address. DORR stated that he, along with Sgt. Brunner, Officer Kuyper and Officer Albers, were the east perimeter group.

DORR stated that his group approached 5128 Angeline Ave N from the east. DORR stated that his group stopped one house to the east of this address and remained stationary. DORR stated that his group utilized two ballistic shields while approaching and while stationary at this location.

DORR stated that while at this position he was able to partially hear KLITZKA while he was in the garage for this address and when he walked out onto the driveway. DORR stated that because of the blowing wind, radio communications, the ballistic shields and KLITZKA's erratic dialogue, he was only able to hear KLITZKA say "die" and random profanities. DORR stated that KLITZKA's voice was loud, erratic and angry. DORR stated that based upon what he heard from KLITZKA, he was "uncomfortable".

DORR stated that he only observed KLITZKA walk out from his garage onto the driveway one time before returning to the inside of the garage and house. DORR stated that when he did observe KLITZKA on the driveway, KLITZKA appeared to be drinking from a bottle and at one point looked directly at DORR and the Officers with him who were approximately 40 feet to the east of him. At this time DORR stated that it was "pretty dark outside".

DORR stated that the two Officers who were on the south perimeter had the best vantage point to observe the actions and movements of KLITZKA. DORR stated these Officers were able to relay to all Officers where KLITZKA was at and what he was doing via radio. DORR stated these Officers observed and relayed to all Officers if KLITZKA was in the garage or in the house. DORR stated that these Officers observed a red laser beam with or moving in tandem when KLITZKA was in the driveway. These Officers informed all Officers that this laser beam appeared to be identical to what

can be mounted on a handgun or rifle to increase accuracy. DORR stated that these Officers informed all Officers that this red laser beam was on the right hand side of KLITZKA.

DORR stated that he heard two separate gun shots from inside KLITZKA's garage while his group was on the east perimeter. DORR stated that it was approximately 10-15 minutes between each shot. DORR stated that after he heard the first shot there was silence. After a few minutes the Officers on the south perimeter informed all Officers that they observed KLITZKA inside the residence walking around. DORR stated that he was unsure of who or what KLITZKA shot at both times.

DORR stated that Dispatch advised all Officers that KLITZKA made the following statements: "I want to die", "I'm gonna shoot everyone" and "I'm gonna blow up my house".

DORR stated that based upon what he learned, observed and heard regarding KLITZA's actions and statements, he began to actively formulate a plan for Law Enforcement to disarm and take KLITZKA into custody. DORR stated that he instructed Officers Albers to retrieve a less than lethal device (shotgun with bean bag rounds).

DORR stated that approximately 10-15 minutes after hearing KLITZKA's second gun shot, DORR stated he heard a third gun shot followed by repeated over the radio. DORR stated that he is a SWAT member and knows that this term is used by SWAT Officers when their weapon is fired and they are not injured. DORR stated that upon hearing aired over the radio, he and his Officers approached KLITZKA's garage. DORR stated that prior to entering the garage, DORR stated he instructed Officer Albers to fire one bean bag round into KLITZKA's body to see if there was any reaction. DORR stated that KLITZKA did not respond to this and that Officer Alvers round struck KLITZKA in his mid section.

DORR stated that upon arriving at the garage, he observed the individual later identified as KLITZKA laying face up in the garage. DORR stated he observed a gun shot wound to KLITKZA's head and a large pool of blood collecting around his body. DORR stated that based upon his training and experience, and observing KLITZKA's injury, he was confident that KLITKA was deceased and that First Aid or medical attention would have been futile.

DORR stated he observed two hand guns between KLITZKA's legs on the ground and a third hand gun on the ground near his right hand. DORR stated he placed his ballistic shield on KLITZKA's person to prohibit any potential movement by KLITZKA when handcuffs were placed on his wrists. DORR stated that once handcuffs were placed on KLITZKA's wrists, KLITZKA was placed onto his stomach and Officers finished handcuffing him. DORR stated that Officers Albers and an unknown Officer handcuffed KLITZKA. DORR stated that at this time he notified the North Memorial paramedics who were on standby down the street to approach the residence and tend to KLITZKA.

DORR stated that all three recovered hand guns were moved away from KLITZKA's person for safety purposes. DORR stated that an Officer stayed with these hand guns while the remaining Officers entered KLITZKA's residence to conduct a safety search for other individuals and weapons. DORR stated that he was a part of this safety search and did not observe anything of note while inside this residence. DORR stated that one of the three hand guns was smaller and black in color. DORR stated that this hand gun had what appeared to be after market modifications on it. DORR stated he was not sure of exactly what there modifications were.

DORR stated that as he was exiting KLITZKA's residence, he observed the North Memorial paramedics pronounce KLITZKA dead at approximately 6:36pm.

DORR stated that no perimeter Officer made contact with KLITZKA at any point based upon KLITZKA's statements to his step daughter, wife and Dispatch on 11-10-2017. DORR stated that all Law Enforcement communications with KLITZKA on scene were through Crystal PD Officer Torvill who is a Crisis Negotiator with the Crystal Police Department.

# SYNOPSIS:

This report pertains to the digitally recorded interview of Crystal Police Sgt. Geoff Kusick DOB by Detectives Nybeck and Nelson at the Crystal Police Department located at 4141 Douglas Dr. Crystal, MN on 11-11-2017. KUSICK was interviewed by Detectives regarding his actions and knowledge regarding the death of Ronald Lee Klitzka (KLITZKA) DOB 11-20-1954 on 11-10-2017 at 5128 Angeline Ave N Crystal, MN. Refer to all reports and attachments in this case file for greater details.

From the Crystal Police Department: Sgt. Kusick

#### NARRATIVE:

On November 11, 2017, Crystal Sgt. Geoff Kusick was interviewed regarding the above incident at 5128 Angeline Avenue North, Crystal. Sgt. Kusick stated that he is a squad sergeant and K-9 handler for the Crystal Police department, and his shift hours on the day of the incident were from 1830 on November 10, 2017, to 0630 on November 11, 2017. Sgt. Kusick's call number for the day was Crystal 3306.

Sgt. Kusick was logging on to his squad and preparing to come to work from his residence. He heard the call and responded from his residence to the scene. When he arrived, he met with Crystal Sergeant Dorr, who was coordinating the scene and handling incident command. He and the other officers on scene had initially staged at Angeline Avenue North and Quail Avenue North approximately two blocks from the target residence.

I asked Sgt. Kusick if he had any prior knowledge of the target residence or the occupants of the home. He told Detective Nybeck and me that he had previously received information from the Brooklyn Park Police Department regarding Ronald Klitzka, who was a resident at 5128 Angeline Avenue North. Brooklyn Park had reportedly placed Ronald Klitzka on a mental health hold at North Memorial Hospital-Robbinsdale several days prior to November 10, 2017. He was placed on that hold following the suicide of his brother, Frederick Kliztka, in the city of Brooklyn Park on or about November 1, 2017. According to Sgt. Kusick, the Brooklyn Park Police Department felt it was highly likely that there would be a suicidal call to the residence if and when Ronald Klitzka was released from North Memorial.

After conferring with other officers on scene, Sgt. Kusick and a response team moved forward as a group to 5122 Angeline Avenue North. This address is on the north side of Angeline Avenue and is

immediately to the east of 5128 Angeline Avenue North. The response team included Sgt. Kusick, Officer Kuyper and Sergeant Brunner from the New Hope Police Department. Sgt. Kusick's K-9 partner did not deploy due to a K-9 team from another department already being on scene. Sgt. Kusick described the scene as being dark with street lights on.

When the response team had bunkered in place in front of 5122 Angeline Avenue North, Sgt. Kusick began to hear more radio traffic. Other officers on the radio were reporting that they had a visual on the suspect. At this point, Sgt. Kusick did not have a visual on the suspect, but he could hear yelling and screaming. He was unable to understand what was being said, but the tone of the yelling and screaming was described as being agitated. During this time, radio traffic was aired that the suspect was making statements that "it's the end" and "it's gonna be a shootout." The officers who had a visual on the suspect reportedly aired that they saw the suspect in his garage with a cigarette in one hand and a black object in the other. It appeared that there was a laser dot coming from the black object.

Sgt. Kusick and the response team still did not have a visual on the suspect. However, Sgt. Kusick heard what he could clearly identify as a gun shot. According to Sgt. Kusick, he then heard radio traffic relating that the suspect had fired a round and gone back inside of the residence. This scenario was repeated on the radio two more times, where the suspect would reportedly come out of the house, fire a round, and return back into the house. Sgt. Kusick heard a total of three shots, all of which were reportedly fired by the suspect. There was a gap of several minutes between each shot fired by the suspect.

We asked if Sgt. Kusick was aware of any specific threats made by the suspect. Sgt. Kusick said it was being aired over the radio that if the officers approached, the suspect would shoot them if he saw them. Further, he was threatening to begin firing into houses in the neighborhood and would, in Sgt. Kusick's words, be engaging the public.

After the third shot was fired by the suspect, Sgt. Kusick said that the suspect's behavior began to clearly escalate. The screaming and yelling intensified. He still could not clearly hear what was being said, but it appeared to be completely erratic. He believed that the situation was rapidly coming to an end point. The screaming from the suspect was becoming louder, as if he might be coming either closer to the response team or coming farther out of the garage.

Sgt. Kusick said he still did not have a visual of the suspect, and that no one on the perimeter was attempting to make contact with the suspect. At this point, Sgt. Kusick heard another shot. He aired that the shot had not come from the response team. A second team on the perimeter aired the words, Sgt. Kusick believed this to be a SWAT team term, indicating that an officer had fired a shot.

At this point, Sgt. Kusick and the response team approached the suspect. The officers on the response team were equipped with two body bunkers and a less-lethal capable shotgun, which was carried by Officer Albers. Officers moved up to the garage and saw that the suspect was down on the floor of the garage, facing up. They could not tell his condition. Sgt. Kusick saw a firearm by the suspect's foot, and another firearm by his right hand. At this time, members of the response team gave verbal commands, ordering the suspect to show his hands. There was no response from the suspect.

When no response was received, Officer Albers fired "one or two" less-lethal rounds at the suspect. There was no movement or response from the suspect. At that point, the response team moved up to the suspect and again saw that he was not moving. Sgt. Kusick could see blood pooling at the suspect's head. Sgt. Kusick moved the handgun away from the suspect's foot and another officer

moved a handgun away from near the suspect's right hand. At that point, Sgt. Kusick noticed an additional firearm near the suspect's foot. He described one of the handguns as a silver-colored semiautomatic handgun, but he could not describe the other handguns.

At this point, members of the response team handcuffed the suspect. To do this, the suspect had to be rolled from his back onto his stomach. Sgt. Kusick stated that based on his training and experience, the suspect was clearly deceased and no medical intervention could save him. However, and EMS team responded to evaluate the suspect as soon as the scene was safe. The suspect was pronounced deceased by EMS.

At that time, several officers, including Sgt. Kusick cleared the residence to search for addition residents and/or victims. No one else was located inside the residence. Sgt. Kusick assisted with setting up a perimeter, before returning to the Crystal Police Department.

Officer Black was interviewed by Detectives regarding his actions and knowledge regarding the death of Ronald Lee Klitzka (KLITZKA) DOB 11-20-1954 on 11-10-2017 at 5128 Angeline Ave N Crystal, MN. Refer to all reports and attachments in this case file for greater details.

# NARRATIVE:

Officer Black has been employed by the New Hope Police Department as a patrol officer for 30 years. On the day in question, his assigned shift was from 0700 hours to 1900 hours. He was assigned the call number of New Hope 4115.

He was on routine patrol within the city of New Hope when he heard a call aired for the city of Crystal regarding a suicidal male with a handgun. It was believed that the male's wife had possibly called 911 and reported that the male had two guns to his head. Further, dispatch aired information that the male was saying that if police approached him, he would shoot them. The call was dispatched at 1711 hours, and Officer Black responded to provide mutual aid, which is normal for his agency due to calls of this nature.

On his arrival, he was directed to begin setting up a perimeter near what he described as being near the 5100 block of Angeline Drive. He was then directed to the area of 53rd and Quail Avenue North, where he stayed for approximately 30-40 minutes. He was then re-directed to move to a house that was directly north of the target house (5128 Angeline Avenue North). He moved because he had learn via radio traffic that the suspect was becoming more agitated and might come outside to engage police.

Officer Black went to the yards to the north of the target house, but he was not able to get a visual of the target residence because of a large privacy fence. It was at this point that he heard at least one shot being fired from what he believed was the target residence. He couldn't see the target house, so he moved to get a better view. He repositioned himself to the southwest corner of the cul de sac. As he was moving through the yards, he heard what he thought was another shot. He moved slightly to the east, where he found a spot with a good visual of the front of the target residence.

He could hear what he believed was the suspect yelling. He could not clearly hear what the suspect was saying. He could make out a word or two, but he could not specifically recall what was said. As he watched the residence, the suspect came into view. He saw a male walking inside of the living room of the residence. Officer Black noted that the lights inside the residence were going on and off. He saw a white male coming out of the house into the garage. He aired that he could see the male to dispatch. He described the male as being white, with a beard. He was wearing a light colored hoodie and blue jeans. Officer Black said that the male appeared to be on the phone, with the phone being held in his left hand. There was something protruding from his right hand that could have been a gun, and there was a red laser light in the area of his right hand. Based on his training and experience, a laser light like the one he was seeing is typically attached to a gun.

The suspect appeared to be very agitated and was yelling. He was pacing around in the garage and near the opening of the garage. He would turn back to walk to the middle of the garage before raising his hands and walking back to the opening of the garage. He saw the laser light as the suspect was walking around. The suspect continued to pace back and forth more rapidly, and his tone was increasingly agitated.

Officer Black heard the suspect yell, "It's over." One to two minutes later, he heard what he described as the suspect saying, "Yee Haw", or something similar. Officer black maintained his position, until he heard another shot that came from his right, to the east. He had seen the male at the entrance to the garage, and he saw the male drop to the ground. At that point, he saw four to five officers approach the suspect, before hearing what he believed to be two rounds from a less-lethal shotgun. He could see the suspect on the ground, but he was not moving. He could not see the suspect's hands.

At that point, Officer Black left his spot and approached the garage. He took cover by a white vehicle that was parked in the driveway. He maintained cover for the response team. The male was turned on to his stomach and handcuffed behind his back. I asked Officer Black if first aid was attempted on the suspect. Officer Black said that based on his training and experience, the suspect was obviously deceased. He had lost copious amounts of blood and he was losing skin color quickly. When the scene was controlled, Officer Black saw three handguns on the ground, approximately 10 feet southeast of the suspect's body. He described the guns as being one revolver and two semiautomatic handguns, with one of the semiautomatic handguns having what he believed to be a laser sight.

A team was assembled to clear the residence. No one else was located inside the residence, and the scene was declared safe. Officer Black was directed to check on Officer Hardy, who was believed to have fired the lethal shot. Officer Hardy advised that he was okay, and Officer Black secured Officer Hardy's rifle. At that time, Officer Black reportedly cleared Officer Hardy's sniper rifle. There were two unfired cartridges in the sniper rifle. A Robbinsdale police officer stood by the sniper rifle and Officer Black returned to his squad. Officer Black stayed in the driveway until the scene he was cleared and directed to leave the scene. He reported that he did not fire his weapon at any time.

#### SYNOPSIS:

This report pertains to the digitally recorded interview of Kari Lynn Snell (SNELL) DOB 9-29-1966 by Detectives Nybeck and Nelson at the Crystal Police Department located at 4141 Douglas Dr. Crystal, MN on 11-10-2017. SNELL was interviewed by Detectives regarding her actions and knowledge related to the death of Ronald Lee Klitzka (KLITZKA) DOB 11-20-1954 on 11-10-2017. Refer to all reports and attachments in this case file for greater details.

## **OFFICERS INVOLVED:**

## NARRATIVE:

On 11-10-17 the above listed Detectives conducted a digitally recorded interview with SNELL at the Crystal Police Department. SNELL was interviewed regarding her actions and knowledge regarding the death of KLITZKA on 11-10-2017. SNELL's interview began at approximately 10:00pm and concluded at approximately 10:40pm. This report will be a summary of SNELL's statements to the Detectives' questions during this interview. The complete interview is saved to this case file as evidentiary value.

SNELL stated that she is the daughter of Nellie Jean Klitzka DOB 1-14-1948 and the step daughter of KLITZKA. SNELL stated that her mother and KLITZKA have been married since 1978 and reside at 5128 Angeline Ave N Crystal, MN.

SNELL stated that she called her mother earlier today because KLITZKA had been having "a bad day" the previous day, 11-9-2017, and wanted to see how both of them were doing. SNELL stated that KLITZKA's brother, Frederick Frank Klitzka DOB 1-8-1960, had committed suicide on 11-6-2017 and that KLITZKA had been the individual that had found him. SNELL stated that her mother told her that KLITZKA wanted to know if his brother's obituary had been posted in the newspaper, that KLITZKA's niece had been calling and texting him from his brother's cellular phone and that KLITZKA was going to have his bother's cellular phone service discontinued today.

SNELL stated that her mother called her later that day at approximately 5:02pm and told her that KLITZKA was having a phone call in which he was screaming "crazy things" at the caller and that she (mother) was worried. SNELL stated that her mother held up her phone to allow her to hear to hear KLITZKA screaming at an unknown female via his cellular phone. SNELL stated she could hear KLITZKA yell "I'm going to kill myself!", Call 911!" and "I want a shoot out!". SNELL stated she could not identify who KLITZKA was talking to other that this individual was a female.

SNELL stated she directed her mother to leave their house immediately and get into her car and drive

to the end of the block. SNELL stated that she informed her mother that she (SNELL) will call 911 (Hennepin County Sheriff's Office Dispatch) and notify Law Enforcement about KLITZKA's actions.

SNELL stated that after she spoke with her mother, she called 911 a few minutes later. SNELL stated she informed 911 of the following: KLITZKA threatened to commit suicide. KLITZKA has hand guns and is holding them to his head. KLITZKA is threating to have "a shoot out". SNELL stated she provided 911 with the names of her mother and father, what vehicles they own and the address for their residence.

SNELL stated that after her call to 911 she immediately drove over to her mother's house. SNELL stated that when she was near her mother's house she observed multiple marked police vehicles near the intersection of Angeline Ave N and Quail Ave N. SNELL stated that when she arrived at this intersection she observed that Law Enforcement was not letting anyone drive down Angeline Ave N. SNELL stated that this intersection is approximately one block east of her mother's house.

SNELL stated that she parked her vehicle by the police vehicles and spoke with Officer Torville. SNELL stated that Officer Torville is a "Negotiator". At this time SNELL informed Officer Torville or her conversation with her mother and what she heard KLITZKA screaming about during this phone call.

SNELL stated she provided Officer Torville with the "floor plans" for the interior of her mother's house, KLITZKA's known medical condition and his cellular phone number, 763-226-3694, and how KLITZKA was having difficulties because of his brother's recent death.

At this point in SNELL's interview, SNELL provided a chronological synopsis of what she was aware of in relation to KLITZKA's personal life during the preceding 4-10 days.

SNELL stated that approximately over one week ago KLITZKA's brother asked to borrow \$1000 from him. SNELL stated hat KLITZKA declined to borrow his brother the \$1000 and that after this request by his brother, KLITZKA had not heard from him (brother). SNELL stated that KLITZKA not hearing or seeing his brother was abnormal since both of them would often meet for breakfast, lunch or dinner. SNELL stated that KLITZKA went to his brother's residence last Sunday, 11-5-17, and attempted to speak with his brother. SNELL stated that when KLITZKA went to the brother's residence on Sunday, there was no answer from inside.

SNELL stated that KLITZKA went to his brother's residence on Monday, 11-6-17, and at this time KLITZKA heard the television on in the residence. SNELL stated that KLITZKA remembered that his brother had told him previously that if his television is on then he is home and that KLITZKA can enter the residence through a sliding door. SNELL stated that KLITZKA heard that the television was on and subsequently entered his brother's residence. SNELL stated that upon entry into his brother's residence, KLITZKA discovered that his brother had committed suicide with the use of a firearm.

SNELL stated that after KLITZKA observed that his brother had committed suicide, he had contact with the Brooklyn Park Police Department outside his brother's residence. SNELL stated that KLITZKA threatened to harm himself in front of the Brooklyn Park Police Officer and that KLITZKA engaged in a physical struggle with this Police Officer. SNELL stated that as a result of his interactions with this Police Officer, KLITZKA was subsequently transported to the North Memorial Hospital via ambulance. SNELL was unsure if KLITZKA was sent to the hospital because of physical injuries sustained or for psychological reasons.

SNELL stated that on Tuesday, 11-7-17, she learned that KLITZKA released himself from the hospital and was currently back at home. SNELL stated that KLITZKA subsequently returned to his brother's residence that day and observed that his sister and nieces were at the brother's residence going through and taking items previously belonging to his brother. SNELL was only able to identify the sister as "Peggy" and one of the nieces as "Brenda". SNELL stated that KLITZKA was extremely angry about observing his other relatives taking the possessions of his brother so quickly after his death.

SNELL stated that on Wednesday, 11-8-17, she, along with her mother, KLITZKA, Peggy and at least one nieces, arranged and then traveled to St. Paul, MN for the cremation of KLITZKA's brother. SNELL stated that "Brenda" repeatedly questioned KLITZKA about where the brother's pick up truck was located and that she wanted possession of it. SNELL again stated that "Brenda's" actions infuriated KLITZKA.

SNELL stated that KLITZKA was repeatedly contacted by "Peggy" and "Brenda" the night of 11-8-17 and 11-9-17 via the cellular phone (calls and text messages) of the deceased brother inquiring about the brother's pick up truck. SNELL stated that KLITZKA was again furious over their actions and made a comment that its was difficult and painful to receive calls and text messages from his dead brother's cellular phone.

SNELL stated that KLITZKA took "a ton of medications" and that nurses would stop by his house multiple times during the day related to his health issues. SNELL stated she did not know exactly what KLITZKA was suffering from or what types of medications he took. SNELL stated that she thought his medications were related to his "pain" but stated she was unsure of exactly what he was suffering from. SNELL stated that KLITZKA did not share or tell his wife or her what he was suffering from. SNELL was informed that her mother had stated KLITZKA had suffered from depression. SNELL was asked if this was true (suffering from depression), how long had KLITZKA been suffering from depression? SNELL responded by stating "probably since 1979 when his son accidently drowned in the care of his first wife".

SNELL stated that she arrived at the intersection of Quail Ave N and Angelina Ave N at approximately 5:35pm. SNELL stated she then talked with Officer Torville in a police vehicle for approximately 10-15 minutes. It was this time that SNELL provided Officer Torville with the above listed information regarding KLITZKA and the residence. SNELL stated that when she initially arrived her mother was not present and was unaccounted for. SNELL stated that Law Enforcement observed a vehicle near her mother's house flashing its head lights. SNELL stated that this vehicle proceeded to drive towards the end of the block where she was located. When this car arrived, the driver and sole occupant of the vehicle was her mother. At this time Law Enforcement spoke to her mother and de-briefed her in regards to what she knew about KLITZKA and what she observed inside her residence prior to leaving.

SNELL stated that after her mother spoke with Law Enforcement, both her and her mother exited the police vehicle and entered her (SNELL's) vehicle. SNELL stated that at approximately 6:02pm she received a call from KLITZKA's personal cellular phone. SNELL stated that KLITZKA informed her that he loved his wife (SNELL's mother), he loved her and that he was "going to go to the Crystal Police Department to shoot cops". SNELL stated she attempted to dissuade KLITZKA from this action and asked him to stay on the phone. SNELL stated that KLITZKA stated "nope" and subsequently hung up on her. SNELL stated she informed Law Enforcement about this call and what KLITZKA had said. SNELL stated that Law Enforcement used her phone in an attempt to call KLITZKA five times between 6:30pm and 6:31pm.

SNELL stated that she could not hear or see the actions taken by Law Enforcement while she was present at this location. SNELL stated that she learned from Law Enforcement that KLITZKA was dead at approximately 6:35pm that night.

## NARRATIVE:

Sergeant Douglas Brunner has been employed by the city of New Hope since 1997. He is currently a patrol sergeant. On the day in question, he was assigned New Hope call number 4104. He shift was 0700-1900. During his shift, he heard a call come out for the city of Crystal regarding a suicidal male who was armed with two handguns. Crystal Police asked for mutual aid from neighboring agencies. Sgt. Brunner, Officer Hardy, Officer Kuyper, Officer Bardon and Officer Black responded.

On his arrival, Sgt. Brunner located Sergeant Dorr of the Crystal Police Department at Angeline Avenue North and Quail Avenue North. Sgt. Dorr was conducting incident command, and Sgt. Brunner assisted him. It was determined that a response team was to be formed to approach the suspect's residence. Sgt. Brunner, Sgt. Dorr, Sgt. Kusick, Officer Kuyper and Officer Albers approached the residence and took up a position near the front steps of the house immediately to the east of the suspect's residence.

Sgt. Brunner said that he could not immediately hear or see the suspect. He could hear dispatch airing various information about the suspect, including that the suspect was making threats to officers and the public. Shortly after the response team had positioned themselves at the steps of the adjacent house, Sgt. Brunner heard a gun shot. He said that the shot came from "very close" to his location; however, he could not tell if it was in his direction or where the shot was headed. At that point, he could hear a male yelling and screaming. He could not make out what was said, but the male seemed agitated.

After hearing the single shot, Sgt. Brunner heard someone say that the suspect was walking down the driveway. It was then reported that the suspect had gone back into the garage, before entering the residence. Sgt. Brunner could still not see the suspect. He did say that information was being relayed that the suspect was saying he would kill police, neighbors and/or anyone he saw. It was then aired

that the suspect had come back out into the garage.

At this time, Sgt. Brunner knew that there was another team located to the south of the target residence. He did not know the team's exact location. He added that no one on the perimeter had attempted to make contact with the suspect, because a negotiator was trying to contact him. At this point, Sgt. Brunner said that he had heard at least two shots, followed by another gunshot. He described that throughout this time, radio traffic was relaying that the suspect was agitated, yelling, and walking around.

Sgt. Brunner then received information via the radio that the suspect had stated he was going to "shoot it out" with police. Sgt. Brunner and the response team determined that if they could get a visual of the suspect, they would use less-lethal fire in an attempt to take him into custody. Officer Albers, who was on the response team, was armed with a less-lethal shotgun. As the team was discussing using less-lethal fire if the opportunity presented itself, they heard another gunshot. It was immediately aired that an officer had fired a shot. At this time, Officer Albers fired two less-lethal rounds at the suspect, who the team could now see was on the floor of the garage. There was no reaction to the less lethal rounds from the suspect. Sgt. Brunner stated that he could see 3 guns by the suspect's feet.

As they approached the suspect, Sgt. Brunner stepped on the suspect's left hand to prevent him from moving. The suspect was rolled over and handcuffed. I asked if first aid was provided for the suspect, and Sgt. Brunner said that the suspect was obviously deceased. Sgt. Brunner and other officers cleared the residence. He said that he saw nothing unusual inside of the residence.

After the residence was cleared, he checked on Officer Hardy and other officers from his department, he notified his agency command of the incident and was cleared from the scene.

# NARRATIVE:

Officer Bardon said that he has been employed by the New Hope Police Department for 14 1/2 years. His assigned shift was from 0700-1900 hours, and he was assigned New Hope call number 4118 on the day of the incident.

At around 5 p.m., Officer Bardon heard a call for the city of Crystal related to a suicidal male. The male reportedly had two guns to his head. The Crystal Police Department requested mutual aid, and several officers from the New Hope Police Department responded. Officer Bardon initially stayed in the city of New Hope until an officer at the scene requested that someone bring a bunker to scene. Officer Bardon responded to the intersection of Angeline Avenue North and Scott Avenue North, which was approximately two houses to the west of the suspect's residence.

After providing the bunker to Officer Kuyper, Officer Bardon maintained his position at Angeline Avenue North and Scott Avenue North. While he was by his squad car, he heard what he recognized as one gunshot. He was directed to begin clearing other houses in the immediate area of the incident. As he was evacuating residents, he heard another gunshot. He described both gunshots as being slightly "muffled". Throughout the incident, radio was constantly updating officers at the scene about what the suspect was saying and/or doing.

He was not able to see the suspect's house, but he could hear a male yelling. He could not hear what was being said. As he cleared the neighboring residences, he heard a loud gunshot. He believed this to be a rifle shot, as it was much louder than the preceding gunshots. He heard over the radio that the suspect was down in the garage of the residence, so he responded to the garage. He saw the suspect lying down, with his feet pointed toward the opening of the garage. He said that the top of the suspect's head appeared to be missing and he could see brain matter. The suspect was obviously

deceased. He said that when he arrived at the garage, the suspect had already been handcuffed. He did not see any guns or weapons.

Officer Bardon assisted with clearing the residence. He noticed nothing unusual. After clearing the residence, he was assigned as Officer Hardy's escort officer. He reported that he had no direct contact with the suspect.

# NARRATIVE:

Officer Jared Kuyper has been employed by the New Hope Police Department for seven years. On the day of the incident, he was working from 0700-1900, and he was assigned as New Hope unit number 4127. At approximately 1700 hours, a call for mutual aid came from the Crystal Police Department. The call was related to a mental health issue. A male suspect was said to have two guns to his head. Officer Kuyper responded to the scene to provide mutual aid, which is a common practice.

Officer Kuyper responded to the scene and took up a position to the west side of the suspect's address. He turned off his lights and waited in place. After waiting for a short time, he requested that an officer from the New Hope Police Department bring a bunker to his location. The officer providing the bunker replaced Officer Kuyper, and Officer Kuyper went to 53rd Avenue North and Quail Avenue North with the bunker. While there, he met up with Crystal Sergeant Dorr, Crystal Sgt. Kusick, New Hope Sergeant Brunner, Plymouth K-9 handler Steve Larson and Crystal Officer Albers.

They formed up a response team and approached the suspect's residence. They took up a cover position near the steps at the home immediately to the east of the suspect's residence. From this position, they did not have a viewpoint into the suspect's garage. After waiting in position, Officer Kuyper saw a white male come out of garage. It appeared that the male was drinking something. He also saw a red dot on the surface of the driveway. The red dot was located at the suspect's feet. According to Officer Kuyper, the red dot appeared to be moving in tandem with the suspect's arm movements. He could see that the suspect was swinging his arm around and the red dot was swinging along with his arm. He did not know if the red dot came from the laser sight on a gun or from a laser pointer. However, he heard a radio dispatch that an officer could see a firearm in the suspect's right hand. The red light was not pointed at him.

The suspect went back into the garage and Officer Kuyper lost sight of him. He heard a shot that appeared to have come from the garage. Officer Kuyper could not say which direction the shot was fired in. He also heard the suspect yelling that he was going to kill himself. The rest of what the suspect was saying was garbled. At that point, dispatchers on scene advised that the suspect had gone back into the house and was turning lights on and off inside the residence. It was then aired over the radio that the suspect had come back out into the garage. Shortly after, another shot was fired. During this time, Officer Kuyper and the rest of the response team continued to hold their position. They still could not see inside of the garage.

Officer Kuyper heard the suspect continue to yell that he was going to kill himself, and that he wanted to be killed. Much of what Officer Kuyper heard was garbled. Police dispatch informed officers that the suspect "wanted a shootout with police." Additionally, dispatch and the negotiator on-scene related that the suspect was on the phone with his sister, he wanted to kill police, he had more fire power than the police, and he wanted a "western style shoot out".

Officer Kuyper believed that at that point the suspect had fired two shots in total. Officer Kuyper heard yet another shot. He could not differentiate between shots fired by the suspect and the shot reported to have been fired by police. However, dispatch advised over the radio that an officer had fired the most recent shot. The response team moved up at this point towards the suspect. As they approached, Sgt. Dorr was shouting verbal commands for the suspect to show his hands. Officer Kuyper said there was no response from the suspect.

As the response team approached, Officer Kuyper saw the suspect on the floor of the garage, with his feet pointed towards them. He saw a pool of blood on the floor of the garage. Sgt. Dorr continued to give verbal commands. When the suspect did not respond, Sgt. Dorr directed Officer Albers to shoot the suspect with a less-lethal shot. Officer Kuyper believed that one less-lethal round was fired. There was no response from the suspect. Officer Kuyper stated that the rifle he was carrying was equipped with a flashlight. He turned the light on. At that point, he saw firearms by the suspect's leg and a firearm by the suspect's right hand. He described the firearms as one revolver and two semiautomatic handguns.

The response team approached and handcuffed the suspect. Officer Kuyper moved a revolver that was by the suspect's right hand, down the driveway and away from the suspect. Officer Kuyper said that the suspect was obviously deceased. Once the scene was secured, officers immediately called for a North Memorial ambulance crew to respond. The ambulance crew arrived and pronounced the suspect deceased. Officer Kuyper then maintained a watch over the handguns, until he was relieved by New Hope Sgt. Brunner.

This report pertains to the digitally recorded interview of Nellie Jean Klitzka (NELLIE) DOB 1-14-1948 by Detectives Nybeck and Nelson at the Crystal Police Department located at 4141 Douglas Dr. Crystal, MN on 11-10-2017. NELLIE was interviewed by Detectives regarding her actions and knowledge related to the death of Ronald Lee Klitzka (KLITZKA) DOB 11-20-1954 on 11-10-2017. Refer to all reports and attachments in this case file for greater details.

# NARRATIVE:

On 11-10-17 the above listed Detectives conducted a digitally recorded interview with NELLIE at the Crystal Police Department. NELLIE was interviewed regarding her actions and knowledge regarding the death of KLITZKA on 11-10-2017. NELLIE's interview began at approximately 9:01pm and concluded at approximately 9:50pm. This report will be a summary of NELLIE's statements to the Detectives' questions during this interview. NELLIE's report will be written in the chronological order in which she answered the Detective's questions. The complete interview is saved to this case file as evidentiary value.

NELLIE stated she is the wife of KLITZKA and has been married to him for 38 years. NELLIE stated that they live at 5128 Angeline Ave N Crystal, MN. NELLIE stated that only KLITZKA and herself live at this residence.

NELLIE stated that KLITZKA met with "Lorna" (identified as Lorna Jean Welch DOB 8-31-1961) earlier today to take care of the property for KLITZKA's deceased brother, Frederick Frank Klitzka DOB 1-8-1960. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA's brother had committed suicide by firearm earlier that week. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA and Lorna were going to attempt to disconnect his brother's cellular phone because it was being used by KLITZKA's niece after the brother's death.

NELLIE stated that KLITZKA came home after meeting Lorna and asked NELLIE what she wanted to do? NELLIE stated that she and KLITZKA went to the Goodwill near their residence, then went to Country Kitchen for a meal and stopped at Target before returning to their residence.

NELLIE stated that when they arrived home, KLITZKA went into the bedroom and sat in a rocking chair after checking his blood sugar levels. NELLIE stated KLITZKA is a diabetic. NELLIE stated that when she entered the house, KLITZKA was already asleep and she was happy because KLITZKA had not been sleeping well since the death of his brother. NELLIE stated that approximately one half hour later KLITZKA began talking out loud to someone on a phone she

believed. NELLIE stated she did not know who KLITZKA was talking to but she thought it may have been one of the nurses that came to their house in the past to work with KLITZKA. NELLIE stated she heard KLITZKA make the following statements to this unknown female: "Why did you kill yourself? (implied brother)" and "its all my fault". NELLIE stated that KLITZKA repeated these statements.

NELLIE stated that approximately one half hour later KLITZKA exited from the bedroom and entered the kitchen where she was at. NELLIE stated KLITZKA was carrying a bottle of Wild Turkey with him as he entered. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA proceed to open the bottle of liquor in her presence. NELLIE stated that she informed KLITZKA that if he drinks this liquor she will call 911 because he is a diabetic. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA responded by stating "You shut up and get the hell out". NELLIE stated that KLITZKA's eyes were small and beady as he was in the kitchen.

NELLIE stated that she proceeded to call her daughter, Kari Lynn Snell DOB 9-29-1966, and tell her about what she overheard KLITZKA say during the phone conversation after they got home that day. NELLIE stated she informed Snell that KLITZKA told the person he was speaking to "I want to shoot myself" and "If I'm not drunk enough I'll make the cops shoot me". NELLIE stated that her daughter informed her to leave the house and that she (Snell) will call 911. NELLIE stated she left the residence shortly after her call to Snell. NELLIE stated she got into "the white car" and drove across the street to where she could still see inside the residence and hopefully observe KLITZKA. NELLIE stated she was parked at this location for approximately 30 minutes before driving to the police vehicles parked at the end of her block.

At this point in NELLIE's interview Detectives went back and asked NELLIE to provide approximate times to the events she had described above.

NELLIE stated that KLITZKA and Lorna left her residence at approximately 9:50am and returned at approximately 1:05pm.

NELLIE stated that she and KLITZKA left their residence at approximately 1:30pm to go to the Goodwill and then arrived at Country Kitchen at approximately 2:15pm.

NELLIE stated that they arrived home from Target at approximately 3:45pm.

Once home NELLIE stated that KLITZKA went inside to check his blood sugar level and proceeded to fall asleep in the room's rocking chair.

NELLIE stated that at approximately 4:15pm she heard KLITZKA talking to someone or himself in the room he had fallen asleep in. NELLIE stated that she heard KLITZKA state the following: "Why did he kill himself?". NELLIE stated KLITZKA may have been speaking with a nurse he was familiar with. NELLIE stated that the door to the room he was in was shut and she did not want to go inside because she did not want KLITZKA to mistake her for a Police Officer and be shot.

NELLIE stated that KLITZKA exited the room with a bottle of Wild Turkey and opened it in her presence while she was in the kitchen. NELLIE stated they argued over him possibly drinking the liquor even though he was a diabetic. NELLIE stated KLITZKA told her "Don't tell me what to do or I'll hit you".

NELLIE stated that she proceeded to call Snell and tell her that KLITZKA "was talking crazy". NELLIE told Snell that KLITZKA stated "Send cops here", "I'll shoot cops if they come here" and "I

want them to kill me" to the individual he was speaking to while on the phone earlier.

NELLIE stated Snell instructed her to leave her house and that she will call 911. NELLIE stated she left her residence at approximately 5:15pm.

NELLIE stated that she drove towards Law Enforcement at approximately 5:31pm. NELLIE stated she informed Law Enforcement about KLITZKA's actions and what had possibly caused them (brother's death). NELLIE also informed Law Enforcement about KLITZKA's three hand guns inside their house.

NELLIE stated that after speaking with Law Enforcement regarding KLITZKA, she and Snell entered Snell's vehicle which was around the block and out of sight of her residence. NELLIE stated that she and Snell stayed there until Law Enforcement explained to her that KLITZKA was dead.

NELLIE stated that the death of KLITZKA's brother "took a lot out of him". NELLIE stated that KLITZKA's brother had asked to borrow \$1000 a week or two previously and that KLITZKA declined to borrow his brother this money. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA's brother went to his brother's residence on 11-6-17 and discovered that he had committed suicide with a firearm. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA was present when Law Enforcement arrived at his brother's residence. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA made self harming and aggressive statements to Law Enforcement at his brother's residence when they arrived. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA was subsequently transported to North Memorial hospital because of these actions and statements towards Law Enforcement that night. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA called her from the hospital that night and requested that she pick him up from there.

NELLIE stated that the following day KLITZKA went back to his brother's residence and at this time observed his sister "Peggy Hamilton", a niece and other family members going through the brother's property and taking his possessions. NELLIE stated that when KLITZKA observed his family members do this, he became extremely angry.

NELLIE stated that KLITZKA received medical care from the Veteran's hospital. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA was prescribed and took large amounts of medication but had discontinued doing both. NELLIE stated KLITZKA used to attend group therapy sessions at the VA but no longer went. NELLIE stated KLITZKA was supposed to receive medication at the VA on 11-7-17 because he needed something to help cope of the death of his brother and "he couldn't take it anymore".

Nellie stated that KLITZKA suffered from depression on an off for a while. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA received shock therapy approximately 25 years ago for depression.

NELLIE stated that KLITZKA called Snell as both of them were in Snell's car today. NELLIE stated that KLITZKA told Snell "I love you and your mother...goodbye" and hung up.

# **SYNOPSIS**

This report pertains to the digitally recorded interview of Robbinsdale Police Officer Casey Landherr, DOB (LANDHERR) Badge 3832, by Detective Kasparek and Deputy Zastera at the Hennepin County Sheriffs Mobile Command Unit on the scene of the address on 11/10/17.

## **OFFICERS INVOLVED:**

From the Robbinsdale Police Department: Officer Casey Landherr

# NARRATIVE:

On 11/10/17, at approximately 2100 hours, LANDHERR was interviewed by Detectives regarding his actions and knowledge regarding the death of Ronald Lee Klitzka (KLITZKA,) DOB 11/20/1954, on 11/10/17 at 5128 Angeline Ave N Crystal, MN.

LANDHERR stated that he was on duty on 11/10/17 from 1400 hours to 0200 hours on 11/11/17 as a patrol officer for Robbinsdale Police Department. He has been with the Robbinsdale Police Department for 10 years.

LANDHERR stated he heard the radio call for Crystal Police to respond to 5128 Angeline Ave N, Crystal. Crystal PD requested additional agencies to respond to assist. Dispatch had aired that the suspect was suicidal and talking of a shootout with the police.

LANDHERR responded to the area near the intersection of Scott Avenue and Angeline Ave and met with Crystal Police and other officers from other agencies to formulate a plan. The squad cars were left at a nearby intersection due to the suspect's address being at a dead end road and would easily see police squads responding.

LANDHERR was instructed by Sgt. Door to obtain a visual on the suspect's address of 5128 Angeline Ave N . LANDHERR and Officer Heasley of Robbinsdale PD, walked west on the railroad tracks, which is south behind the houses on

Angeline Ave N. LANDHERR and Officer Heasley were able to gain a good visual behind the address at 5123 Angeline Ave N. They remained behind the house at 5123 Angeline Ave N and were able to see into the open garage of the suspect's address. LANDHERR had a long gun with him.

LANDHERR described the suspect's house as a blue house with white trim but wasn't able to see a house number. He checked on his cellphone on google maps and was able to confirm that house was the suspect's address.

While maintaining visual of the suspect's address, LANDHERR heard a phone ringing in the suspect's house. LANDHERR was able to determine that it was not a negotiator calling the suspect's phone.

While maintaining visual on the suspect's house, LANDHERR observed the suspect walked out of the house and into the garage and into the driveway. The suspect matched the description of a male suspect who was described as wearing a grey sweatshirt with writing on the front, blue jeans and was approximately 5'7", medium build.

The male was outside yelling but LANDHERR could not recall exactly what he was yelling. The male then went back inside the house. LANDHERR does not recall anything being in the suspect's hand at this time.

LANDHERR was not able to see any movement inside suspect's house. LANDHERR observed a family, two adults and two kids, who were outside in the driveway of the house just to the west of the suspect's address. LANDHERR was concerned for the welfare of the family, as they may be mistaken for the police by the suspect. LANDHERR aired that contact needs to be made with this family and tell them to go inside the house.

The suspect came out of the residence again and by that time the family had gotten into a car and left the area. When the suspect came out of the residence and onto the driveway, he was yelling but LANDHERR could not understand what the suspect was yelling, and didn't know who he was yelling at. LANDHERR observed what he thought was a cigarette in the suspect's right hand due to a red glow. In suspect's left hand LANDHERR observed a shiny object but could not see what it was.

Shortly thereafter LANDHERR observed the object in suspect's right hand to be a laser sight from a handgun. The suspect walked back into the garage and was standing near or in front of the maroon SUV and was yelling and fired a shot from what LANDHERR thought was a handgun. Suspect was flailing his arms and appeared to be upset as he was continuously yelling and screaming. LANDHERR saw the suspect facing towards the street while standing in the garage. LANDHERR could not see the suspect the entire time as he was trying to remain behind the house for safety. LANDHERR believes the suspect had the gun pointed in a downward direction. After the suspect fired a shot, "Shots fired"

was then aired. The suspect then retreated back inside the house. LANDHERR then observed the lights in the house and in the garage go off and on several times. LANDHERR believed the suspect to be near the garage door inside the house.

New Hope Police Officer Harty arrived at LANDHERR's location. LANDHERR briefed Officer Harty on what was taking place, what he could see of what the suspect was doing, how the lights were going on and off at the suspect's residence and how far out the suspect was walking, which was to the end of the driveway to the street.

Officer Harty then took a perimeter spot along the east side of the address of 5127 Angeline Ave N. This is next to the address where LANDHERR was located. Officer Harty had a .308 rifle with him and positioned himself on the ground next to an air conditioning unit.

LANDHERR said he assisted Officer Harty. He asked if Officer Harty had a spotting scope, which he did not. Officer Harty wanted to know the range and gave his range finder to LANDHERR who was able to relay a distance of 82 yards from the back of the garage from their location. It was dark and difficult to see if the range finder was hitting the tree branches. LANDHERR has never used a spotting scope.

LANDHERR estimated that the inside of the garage was 63 to 72 yards, or 70 yards to the front of the garage. Officer Harty was parallel to LANDHERR but about 8 feet to the west of him.

It was aired that the neighbors needed to be contacted for safety purposes. At this time, the suspect again came out of the house and into the garage and fired another shot. The suspect appeared to be angry as he was still yelling. LANDHERR observed the suspect to have something in his hand that had a red laser dot. LANDHERR aired that he did not have a shot at the suspect with his rifle based upon the distance he was at. LANDHERR did not feel he was capable of shooting at the suspect due to the distance.

LANDHERR decided that he an Officer Heasley would stay where they were and relay information to other officers as they had a good visual of the suspect's residence.

The second time the suspect came out of the house, he appeared angrier as his behavior was more heightened and was yelling more. It appeared he was at a higher level of anger by his actions.

The suspect then went back into the house. It was aired that a less lethal shotgun would be used. Based on LANDHERR's location he could not see approaching officers.

The suspect again came out of the residence and was mainly moving around in

the garage and yelling. LANDHERR could hear a lot of talking and could not understand what the suspect was saying. It may have been possible he was talking to someone on the phone.

Dispatch again aired that the suspect was suicidal and wanted to have a shootout with the police and would start shooting at other residences and was going to shoot at whatever. LANDHERR got the impression that the suspect was going to start shooting indiscriminately. LANDHERR stated this was discussed with Officer Heasley and Officer Harty.

While the suspect was in the garage and moving around a lot, the red dot was visible and then not visible. LANDHERR couldn't see that well as he was trying to maintain cover behind the house and at times had limited view due to shrubbery in his line of sight.

Officer Harty was laying on the ground with little to no concealment or cover.

LANDHERR then heard an "audible boom" come from Officer Harty firing a shot at the suspect.

It was aired of "one down." LANDHERR did not see the suspect fall to the ground. LANDHERR asked Harty if he could see any movement. Harty told LANDHERR that he could not see any movement. LANDHERR said the suspect was not visible as the tree was in the way. LANDHERR said he was exposed each time he tried to see the suspect.

LANDHERR and Officer Heasley then went to the front of the yard where they were and took concealment by a trellis and joined other officers in front of the suspect's residence. A less lethal was then fired at the suspect. Officers were in the driveway of the suspect's address and officers gave commands to the suspect who was down on the ground. The suspect was laying on his back at the threshold just inside of the garage. No response was received from the suspect. LANDHERR observed two handguns, one of which by the suspect's right hand and one at the suspect's feet.

An officer moved the guns away from the suspect and the suspect was rolled over and LANDHERR pulled suspect's left arm out, placed it in a cuffing position and the suspect was then handcuffed.

A code four was called and it was stated that the suspect was in custody. Officers then cleared the residence and found no one inside.

LANDHERR and Officer Heasley were told to return back to their original positions behind the address of 5123 Angeline Ave N. They then returned to their original position behind the house.

This concludes the interview of Officer Landherr at approximately 2145 hours.

# <u>SYNOPSIS</u>

This report pertains to the digitally recorded interview of Robbinsdale Police Officer Joshua Heasley, DOB (HEASLEY) Badge 3830, by Detective Kasparek and Deputy Zastera at the Hennepin County Sheriffs Mobile Command Unit on the scene of the address on 11/10/17.

# NARRATIVE:

On 11/10/17, at approximately 2153 hours, HEASLEY was interviewed by Detectives regarding his actions and knowledge regarding the death of Ronald Lee Klitzka (KLITZKA,) DOB 11/20/1954, on 11/10/17 at 5128 Angeline Ave N Crystal, MN.

HEASLEY stated that he was on duty on 11/10/17 from 0600 hours to 1800 hours a patrol officer for Robbinsdale Police Department. He has been with the Robbinsdale Police Department for 7 months.

HEASLEY stated that at approximately 1713 hours, the Crystal Police Department was dispatched to 5128 Angeline Ave N, Crystal on a mental suicidal issue. Further info was aired that the suspect was armed with two handguns and wanted to harm himself and shoot himself in the head. Crystal Police requested the assistance of the New Hope and Robbinsdale Police.

HEASLEY responded to the area and met with officers to establish a plan. HEASLEY originally had a less lethal rifle with him and then it was determined that HEASLEY and Officer Landherr would obtain a vantage point where they could check for the mother who may be in the area and get a view of the suspect's residence. No one had a visual of the suspect's residence yet. HEASLEY then put his less lethal back in his squad car.

HEASLEY and Officer Landherr walked west on the railroad tracks, behind the houses on Angeline Avenue N. They were able to obtain a vantage point behind a residence across from the suspect's house. HEASLEY was able to see the garage and the front bay window of the suspect's residence. HEASLEY did not have a long gun with him, only his hand gun.

HEASLEY observed a family who was outside directly to the west of the suspect's house. A short time later, this family got into a vehicle an left the area.

Dispatch further aired that the suspect was not responding to attempts to speak with police and making further statements that the suspect wanted to shoot it out with the police.

HEASLEY made contact with two houses directly across the street from the suspect's residence and advised the residence to take cover in their basements.

HEASLEY observed the suspect walk out of the house into the garage and to the end of the driveway and possibly into the street. This male matched the suspect's description that was aired. It appeared the suspect was smoking a cigarette. The male then walked back into the house. HEASLEY could hear yelling coming from inside the house and also heard a phone ringing. HEASLEY was told that it was not law enforcement on the phone with the suspect.

HEASLEY again walked back out of the house and into the garage and it appeared that the suspect had a gun or weapon in his right hand as HEASLEY could see a red light, which appeared to be a laser pointer which was pointed on the ground. The suspect was walking back and forth in the garage and was yelling things incoherently.

The suspect then fired off one round from the handgun in his right hand. The suspect was deep into the garage and it looked like he was in front of the vehicle in the garage. HEASLEY then took cover further behind the house. The suspect then went back into the house and HEASLEY observed lights in the house and garage being turned off and on.

Incident command aired that a sniper team would be deployed to HEASLEY's location as he and Officer Landherr had the best visual of the the suspect's residence.

The suspect came out of the house again and continued to shout and yell. The suspect walked to the end of the driveway with a handgun, HEASLEY could see the laser pointer that was illuminating the suspect's right hand and the ground.

It appeared suspect had what appeared to be a cellular phone in his left hand. It looked like suspect was talking to someone.

The suspect then went back into the residence and again came back outside and was yelling and shouting as he looked around. Another shot was fired by the

suspect. HEASLEY could not see where the shot was fired as the suspect's arms were flailing around.

New Hope Police Officer Harty arrived at HEASLEY's location. Officer Harty is a sniper and took a position along the east side of the address of 5127 Angeline Ave N. This is next to the address where HEASLEY was located. HEASLEY was close enough to Officer Harty where they could speak to each other, approximately five feet.

After the suspect fired the second shot, the suspect then went into the house and HEASLEY observed lights in the house being turned off and on. While the inside house lights were off, HEASLEY could see inside the bay window of the house and observed what looked like a laser pointer scanning through the front bay window. HEASLEY didn't know if the suspect was trying to acquire a target.

The suspect then exited the house into the garage and was screaming incoherently, not making any sense but HEASLEY heard him say something about the police. The suspect then went deeper into the garage and out of HEASLEY's sight. Officer Harty told HEASLEY that he was able to maintain visual on the suspect and told HEASLEY that the suspect went in to the back yard. The suspect then came back into the garage. It appeared the suspect was still armed and suspect was flailing his arms around. Officer Harty then fired a shot at the suspect.

When the shot was fired, the suspect was making his way back out of the garage and into the driveway. HEASLEY did not hear all of the radio traffic as his portable radio was dead.

Officer Harty advised that the suspect was down. HEASLEY and Officer Landherr advanced toward the Crystal Officers who were to the north.

Officers advanced towards the suspect and up to the garage area. HEASLEY could see the male suspect down on the ground at the threshold of the garage. The suspect appeared to have a gunshot to the face. Officers gave suspect verbal commands to show his hands. They received no response. A less lethal round was fired at the suspect and no movement was seen by the officers. HEASLEY observed a firearm at the feet of the suspect and at suspect's right hand was a pistol. The suspect was then handcuffed. HEASLEY kicked the two handguns away from the suspect.

Officers then cleared the residence and did not find anyone inside. North Memorial Ambulance arrived on scene, made an evaluation and left the scene. HEASLEY then retreated to his original position behind the house across the street. HEASLEY and Officer Landherr stayed with Officer Harty's rife and shell casing, so the area wouldn't be compromised.

HEASLEY further stated that he strongly believes that the suspect's end goal was

to have a shootout with the police, as indicated by suspect's statements and the suspect firing shots. HEASLEY stated the suspect was a danger to public safety especially as no one knew how many people were at home in the cul-de-sac.

HEASLEY said it appeared that the agitation level of the suspect was far greater the last time the suspect came out of the house and fired the shot. The suspect was more animated, and the agitation level appeared to have slowly built to a 'breaking point.' The suspect's demeanor and behavior was far different than the first two times when the suspect came out of the house. HEASLEY stated, "No one could predict what the suspect's next action would be."

This concludes the interview of Officer Heasley at approximately 2211 hours.

On 11/10/17, at approximately 1145 hours, Detective Kasparek along with Dep. Zastera knocked on several doors and tried to make contact with residences to learn if they had observed or heard anything that had taken place in relation to the 5128 Angeline Ave N incident.

The following address on Angeline Avenue North were checked:

Contact was made at 5117 Angeline Avenue N. Homeowner Lynne Marie Thiebault, 612-850-9163, stated that she had heard a loud "pop" around 6:15 – 6:30 PM tonight. A few minutes later, a Crystal Police Office knocked on her door and advised her to go into the basement and to stay away from any windows. Thiebault stated she then heard a second and a third shot, approximately 5 – 10

minutes apart.

We also asked her about her camera that we had observed outside her door. She stated that she could not access the camera footage but would call AT&T and obtain the footage for us.I said I would contact her on Monday regarding retrieving the video from her.

On November 11, 2017, we received Crystal Police body camera and squad footage for review. I Sergeant Ramone Walton of the Hennepin County Sheriff's Office reviewed the body camera footage for the following Crystal Police Officers: Sergeant Brandon Dorr and Officers Albers & Tourville. It should be noted all squad cars were parked at least a half block from the suspect's home so the shooting was not captured on video. None of the body cameras captured any of the shooting. The body cameras only captured the officers approaching the home after the suspect was shoot to handcuff the suspect and to clear the residence. All body cameras captured most of the same things and I will give a summary of Sergeant Brandon's Dorr's body camera.

Sergeant Brandon Dorr's body camera consisted of one hour forty three minutes and twelve seconds (1:43:12) of footage. Once Dorr arrives he gets information from dispatch that they had just gotten off the phone with a 911 caller who was Ronald Klitzka's step-daughter. The caller heard her step-dad say he would kill himself or have an officer kill him. Caller stated Ronald has two handguns in his possession and he is very agitated.

Per dispatch, Ronald had been on the phone talking with a psychologist and the psychologist called into dispatch and informed dispatch that Ronald told them that he would either kill himself or have the police kill him.

After about twenty-five minutes on scene officers were still staging and waiting for more officer's to arrive and set up a perimeter. The suspect's wife Nelly Klitzka came and met with officers a block away. Nelly stated her husband had been grieving the death of his half-brother Fred who committed suicide four days earlier. Nelly stated the suspect had seen his doctor recently and was given new medicine and the medicine has caused Ronald to not sleep much and Ronald threatened to kill himself and she believes he possibly will follow through with killing himself. Nelly also stated Ronald informed her that he has more firepower than the police. Nelly stated Ronald had been drinking and is acting very crazy.

At 40:00 into the body camera footage, per dispatch Ronald called dispatch and stated he would be coming out of his home shooting and then disconnects the call.

At 41:00 into the video, Ronald comes out of the home briefly and into the garage smoking a cigarette and immediately reenters the home.

At 45:00 into the video, Ronald calls dispatch again and states he's going to kill himself and then disconnects the call.

At 54:00 into the video, Ronald is in the garage and officers could see a red laser from his gun pointing at the garage floor. Ronald is yelling to himself and then fires a single shot. No one is close enough to see where the shot was fired.

At 56:00 into the video, Ronald is doing a lot of yelling in the garage and stating he wants it over.

At 1:08 into the video, Ronald calls dispatch and is threatening to shoot officers and dispatch airs this to officers.

At 1:11 into the video, Ronald calls dispatch very irate and is threatening to shoot neighboring homes and everyone in sight and then disconnects the call.

At 1:12 into the video, officers see Ronald inside the home standing in the front bay window holding

a gun with a red laser sight aiming it out of the window.

At 1:17:55 into the video, Ronald comes out into the attached garage and fires another shot and is heard screaming and yelling to himself.

At 1:20 into the video, dispatch airs that Ronald is on the telephone with his sister and the family is trying to talk him down. Dispatcher stated she could hear Ronald who sounds extremely agitated because the sister was talking with Ronald and someone else at the sister's home was on a different line with dispatch. Ronald is standing in the entrance of the overhead garage door with a handgun in his right hand.

At 1:21:20 into the video, Officers come over the radio stating Ronald is getting ready to walk out of his garage with a handgun and he's screaming. You hear one shot over the radio and sniper states which means suspect down. Officers start to slowly approach the residence.

At 1:22:40 into the video, body camera footage shows Ronald laying on the ground with handguns around him but he's not moving. Sergeant Brandon Dorr tells Officer Albers to bean bag Ronald. Several officers are yelling for Ronald to show his hands and Ronald still doesn't move after being bean bagged. Officers then approach and cuff Ronald.

At 1:23:39 into the video, a code 4 is called. North Memorial Ambulance come to residence. Paramedic Brian Junkin pronounces Ronald deceased at 1836 hours. North Ambulance run number is AL 750795 and Ronald is searched and found to be in possession of three handguns.

After this the residence is cleared and officers are instructed to turn off body cameras.

## NARRATIVE:

I, Deputy Sheriff Patrick Chelmo #455, am assigned as a Detective for the Hennepin County Sheriff's Office. On the evening of Friday, November 10, 2017 I was off-duty and was called to assist with a Death investigation in the City of Crystal. The only information I had during my initial response was that the case involved an Officer Involved Shooting.

I arrived in the area of 5128 Angeline Avenue North where I met Sergeant McKloskey and other detectives. I was told the deceased, Ronald Lee Klitzka (11/20/1954), had been killed by police after threatening suicide and discharging a firearm multiple times. We eventually learned Klitzka had a history of mental illness and treatment for this.

As part of the investigation, I prepared a search warrant for the residence at 5128 Angeline Avenue North to search for firearms and ammunition, medications and illicit drugs, any diaries, notes or medical documentation related to mental health and/or illness. This warrant was reviewed and signed by the Honorable Judge Jeannice Reding of the Hennepin County District Court Bench.

This warrant was executed at 0010 hours on Saturday, November 11, 2017. Prior to any searching being conducted, the condition of the residence was photographed and documented by Crime Scene Investigator Michael Kipka. Once completed, officers began a systematic search of the residence. When items of evidence were located, they were photographed, in place, before they were collected, packaged, labeled and logged on scene. In total, 23 items were packaged and listed on the Inventory Receipt. The following is a list of items collected, as well as locations located and by whom:

Each of these items was packaged and labeled on scene, where they were transferred to CSI Kipka. They will be held at the Hennepin County Sheriff's Office Crime Laboratory where further testing and processing will be conducted as the investigation progresses.

Investigator Burkhalter from the Hennepin County Medical Examiner's Office arrived and examined the decedent and scene. He advised he found and collected a black "flip-style" cell phone, a wallet with identifying documents for Klitzka and three magazines containing ammunition. These were retained by the Hennepin county Medical Examiner's Office and will be transferred to the Sheriff's Crime Laboratory at a later time.

There were three handguns taken off Klitzka's body as officers secured him after the shooting located at the scene. These were found laying in the driveway of the residence. There was an orange-colored, less-lethal, shotgun used by officers in the vicinity of Klitzka's body as well. These were collected from the driveway and, therefore, were not listed as being taken during the execution of the search warrant. They were collected by HCSO personnel and inventoried with the Crime Laboratory.

Following the completion of the search, photographs of the residence were taken by CSI Kipka to document the condition of the home and property. All evidence was transferred to the custody of CSI Kipka. The residence and scene were left in control of the HCSO Crime Scene Unit personnel as they completed the scene processing.

Just prior to my departure, staff from Bio-Tec Emergency Services arrived with Lt. Underthun of the Crystal Police Department to begin the clean-up and decontamination of the scene.

The house was blue in color with a large bay window on the eastside of the front of the house and the garage on the west side of the house. The bay window did not have any coverings over the window allowing you to see into the residence. Also located between the window and the garage was the front door to the residence which was closed.

The garage door was open.Inside the garage was a red Buick MN LIC "KLITZKA".This vehicle was parked on the west side of the two stall garage.The east side was vacant.The garage had cabinet along the north side wall along with numerous tools and tools chests along the wall.

I observed the decedent, Klitzka, lying on his stomach handcuffed behind his back using two pairs of handcuffs. He was fully clothed. There were two pools of blood near the head area, one where he was current lying and one to the east of the body.

In the driveway, was an orange and black shotgun, a black bunker and three handguns lying together. These items were all within 10 feet south of the decedent. The handguns were identified as a Springfield armory model 1911-A1, .45 caliber serial number NM381540; a Ruger LC9 9mm serial number 323-43833; a Ruger Mod Vaquero .45 caliber revolver serial number 57-03978.

I meet with CSI Rucker, who had already begun processing the scene CSI Rucker informed me that the red arrow markers on the floor of the garage were identified bullet fragments. There were numerous fragments all over the floor CSI Rucker showed me identified bullet holes located in the cabinets on the north wall of the garage and inside the cabinet was a red tool box that appeared to have a fired bullet lodged in the side.

The inside of the residence was not processed yet as a search warrant was being written to search the residence.

I then met at the command post with Detective Kasparek, Det. Chelmo, Sgt. Walton, Lt Bakke, Major Storms and Lt Underthun from the Crystal Police Department. #### PRELIMINARY PARAGRAPH

On 11-10-2017 at approximately 1709 hours, I was dispatched a mental issue occurring in the city of Crystal at 5128 Angeline Avenue North. Dispatch notes stated RONALD KLITZKA, phone number of 763-421-6021, second hand info, father has two guns to his head, one revolver, one 9 mm, says he wants to be shot by police, childhood friend of Doug Leslin, mother leaving the house may be sitting in red Buick at the end of the street.

#### UPON ARRIVAL

Upon arrival, we set up a command post at the intersection of Quail and Angeline Avenue North. At that time, Sergeant Dorr stated he was going to gather resources from additional agencies and did not want to approach the home due to the confirmation of weapons being involved until we had adequate back up.

At that time, as a SWAT team negotiator, I began to gather as much intel as possible from the reporting party, KARI LYNN SNELL, DOB 09-29-1966. Snell stated that her stepfather, RONALD LEE KLITZKA, was suicidal and wanted to have a shoot out with police. She stated Ronald's brother, Freddie, had apparently killed himself possibly on Monday, 11/06/2017. She stated that Ronald had found Freddie and had not been right since. She stated that Ronald does have two guns. She was later informed by her husband that one of them was a 45 caliber revolver and they believed the other one to be a 9 mm handgun. Snell stated that Ronald was a Vletnam vet and was on disability due to a disability he received from contact with Agent Orange. She said he makes regular trips to the V.A. and that he has been consuming Wild Turkey brand alcohol. At that time, I took several notes on the notepad in my squad car which is unavailable to me at the time of this report.

Snell stated that her mother, NELLIE JEAN KLITZKA, DOB 01-14-1948, was still in the home. She stated she instructed her to leave and that she may be in a red SUV vehicle down the street.

While I continued to talk to Snell, a car approached our location. At this time, Snell stated that was her mother, Nellie, and that she was glad she was safe. She did not drive the red Buick instead taking the white, four door vehicle. At that time, Nellie stated that Ronald did have handguns and was threatening suicide. I attempted to gather more information from Nellie and I spoke with her briefly. After a brief period of time, dispatch updated officers that Ronald had just called from the number 763-226-3694 and said he was coming out shooting and hung up. At that time, officers began to move up towards the house in case Ronald did come out. At that time, I attempted to call Ronald on the house number provided by Snell. This number was disconnected and at this time Snell informed me that was Ronald's number. I continued to try several times without success. The phone appeared to be off the hook as it constantly was being busy. The number I called, 763-537-2722. I attempted to call this number 23 times between 1814 hours and 1820 hours. I then also called 763-226-3694 approximately 23 times where it would either ring through to wicemail or go straight to voicemail. While attempting to call Ronald, I did have my portable radio and squad radio turned down in case I made contact. After a brief period of time, I heard one gun shot. I then turned on my radio and heard officers which were closer to the incident location state that the male was in the garage and had discharged one round.

I continued to attempt to contact Ronald on the numbers provided and again was not successful. After a brief period of time, I heard a second gun shot. I was informed by officers on scene that Ronald had fired a second round somewhere in the garage. After a brief period of time, I heard dispatch air that Ronald had called one of his sisters and was telling her that his time was almost up and that he was going to come out firing. After a brief period of time again, I heard a third gunshot. At this time, I heard officers state less lethal only and that they were code 4. I then moved my squad car, #204, from the intersection of Quail and Angeline Avenue North into the driveway of 5128 Angeline Avenue North. I exited my squad car and observed a male, believed to be Ronald Lee Klitzka, DOB 11-20-1954, with an obvious gunshot wound to the head, laying on the garage floor. At

that time, I observed Officer Kuyper from the New Hope Police Department standing watch over two -firearms believed to belong to Klitzka.

#### FURTHER OFFICER ACTIONS

I then began to assist with the crime scene preservation as I began to set up police tape. After a brief period of time, I was informed to return to the Crystal Police Department with Chief Revering to speak with family.

Chief Revering and I made contact with Kari Snell and Nellie Klitzka who were in the same motor vehicle near the intersection of Angeline and Quail. Chief Revering informed Nellie that Ronald was no longer with us. She asked Nellie and Kari to meet us at the Crystal Police Department so we could discuss the situation further. Kari and Nellie agreed to do so and later arrived at the Crystal Police Department.

Once at the Crystal Police Department, I sat in a room with Neilie and Kari. I attempted to comfort them and informed them I was not able to provide many answers at that time due to me being in a squad car near them and not on the scene.

While speaking with them, Nellie stated that Klitzka had saved a bottle of Wild Turkey whiskey on a shelf for a special occasion. She stated that Ronald had been having a very difficult week since his brother passed and that he had been unable to sleep and had been talking a lot about how he felt responsible for his brother, Freddie's, death. She stated that Freddie called Ronald and asked him to borrow \$1000.00 and Ronald had told him no. She said that Ronald had gone to Freddie's house one day as Freddie was not returning his calls and the house was locked and the lights were on. She stated that Ronald went back the next day and found Freddie deceased with two gunshot wounds to the head. She stated that other family members began to act inappropriate and were taking items out of the house. She also stated that a relative of Ronald who lives in Wilmar took credit cards and began spending on them. She stated that while she is sad Ronald is gone she is also okay with it because now he is at peace. She stated Ronald had a very difficult time with Freddie being deceased. Nellie stated that she had gone to Country Kitchen with Ronald earlier in the evening on 11-10-2017. She stated that after dinner she stopped at Target to get three Cokes and a Sprite. She said that Ronald was mumbling when they got there and she asked Ronald what he was talking about. She stated that Ronald said he was fine and that he was going to remain in the vehicle. She said she returned to the vehicle and Ronald was still saying things out of the ordinary. She stated that she told him to go inside and check his blood sugar as she thought he may be having a diabetic issue. She stated that once inside she went in the kitchen to do the scratch off tickets and then Ronald returned to the kitchen with a bottle of alcohol. She stated he started to drink the alcohol and she told him if he didn't stop that she would be calling the police. She stated at that time Ronald told her to get out of the house and that it was his. She stated that while he said that he did have a firearm in his hand.

She stated that Ronald did not threaten her but was acting out of the ordinary. She stated that she exited the home and took the four door sedan, because she wanted the ambulance to have a clear path to the door of the home. She stated that she parked in the neighbor's driveway for a brief period of time and wondered where the police were going. She stated she observed a bunch of traffic near the intersection of Quail and Angeline Avenue North so she went down to investigate where she ran into myself.

At that time, Chief Revering returned to the room where I was sitting with Karl and Nellie. Chief Revering relieved me of my duties,

# 002-ORIGINAL REPORT 192 11/06/17

#### PRELIMINARY INFORMATION:

On November 6, 2017, at approximately 1950 hours, I, Officer D. Daniels, Badge 192, along with other officers of the Brooklyn Park Police Department were dispatched to 8221 Riverview Lane North, apartment 43 in regard to a what was initially dispatched as a help unknown problem. Prior to officers' arrival, dispatch advised that a party was claiming his brother had shot and killed himself.

#### OFFICER'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

Upon arrival, I made contact with a party, whom was later identified by Officer R. Anderson, Badge 204, as the brother of the deceased, Ron. Ron stated his brother had committed suicide and stated if you go inside the apartment and turn to the right, you'll see his brother. Upon going inside, I did locate the deceased party, Frederick Frank Klitzka (01/08/60). It appeared Klitzka had shot himself in the head and had been deceased for some time as his body was decomposing. The hand gun was still in his hand. Crime lab was started to the scene and other officers did arrive on scene. Officer Anderson then spoke to the brother and I spoke to another party, whom arrived on scene, who is identified as Lorna Jean Welch (08/31/61). Welch stated that her and Klitzka were best friends, and her kids looked at Klitzka as a father figure.

- She spoke to Klitzka, pretty much every weekend, and they would see each other every weekend.
- They were close enough friends that she had keys to his apartment.
- The last time she saw him was last Sunday as he came over to her house; they watched a movie.
- She did not suspect anything of being wrong whatsoever as they made plans about what they were going to do on Black Friday.
- She had not spoken to him since then, and she'd never thought he would be suicidal.
- She thought it was possible she would be taken him back to treatment for alcohol issues as he had gone in January the previous year; however, did not believe him to be suicidal.
- His brother mentioned something about loaning him \$5000, but she did not know anything about that.

Other parties did eventually arrive on scene and were all kept out of the apartment. One party arrived was his niece and she stated that her mother was Klitzka's sister. His sister was identified as Peggy Ann Hamilton (12/26/56). I stood by as crime lab and the medical examiners arrived on scene. Crime lab's case number was 172365. Crime lab was able to remove the gun, which was a black Semi-Auto Springfield XD-S, serial number S3828506. Was speaking with family members and Welch, it was determined that Kliztka was left handed and the gun he shot himself with belonged to his brother, Ron. It was obvious that Ron was having a very tough time dealing with this and was blaming himself and yelling out loud. He made multiple mentions of wanting to end it all himself, and when speaking with Officer Anderson, made other statements regarding harming himself. He was placed on a hold. See Officer Anderson's report for further detail. I stood by until crime lab and medical examiner were done. At this time, the apartment was turned over to Welch and the decease' niece. Hamilton was also on her way and was very close at this time. It should also be noted that while I was inside, I did see that there were two letters under the door from management. I opened these as to possibly get evidence as to

how long the letters have been sitting there. First letter was from November 3rd, stating that rent was past due, and it was a bill for the rent past due with \$50 late fee. The next letter was from November 6, 2017, which stated that they had received payment and that they would be starting the eviction process if payment was not received soon. Photo of these letters were taken by crime lab.

#### PRELIMINARY INFORMATION:

On November 6, 2017, at approximately 1952 hours, I, Officer R. Anderson, Badge 204, along with other officers were dispatched to a possible suicide at 8221 Riverview Lane, apartment 43.

Prior to arrival, we were getting conflicting information as far as what had occurred; however, by the time we arrived on scene, it did appear that the reporting party was advising that they found their brother dead from a gunshot wound.

#### OFFICER'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

Upon arrival at approximately 1956 hours, other officers entered the apartment, while I stood outside with a white male, who was later identified as Ronald Klitzka (11/20/54).

I initially tried to speak with Ronald Klitzka; however, he yelled at me and told me to back off. While other officers were inside the apartment, I did allow Klitzka some space and learned that he was the reporting party.

While I was standing by outside, Ronald Klitzka made statements to the effect that this was all of his fault and he caused his brother to kill himself. Klitzka also stated that he is a gun carrying permit holder and had he had his gun with him today, that he would've killed himself right by his brother after he found him here.

As time went on on scene, Klitzka still made comments such as that there was no God and there was nothing left for him to live for. He stated that he had lost his son earlier this year and now his brother, and that he might as well die.

Other family members did arrive on scene and were spoken with by officers.

At some point, Ronald Klitzka advised that he wanted to leave the scene. I did ask him if he was thinking about killing himself and Klitzka stated that he was going to leave, go get drunk and drive his vehicle into a wall.

Based on this information, I was extremely concerned for Klitzka's health and welfare, and believed that if he was allowed to leave the scene, he may go commit suicide.

I did call Klitzka's wife, who was verbally identified as Nelly (sp?) over the phone at (763) 537-2722. She stated that her husband has been having issues recently and that the best place for him would be a hospital.

I did later fill out a health and welfare hold for Klitzka, in which I gave to the north paramedics.

When I advised Klitzka that I was going to send him to the hospital for a hold, he did look at him with an extremely angry face, yelled at me and took off his jacket and took a fighting stance with me. Klitzka, however, did not do anything and just seemed extremely emotional and angry.

Klitzka did walk to the ambulance willingly and was transported by North to North Memorial Robbinsdale.

The only noise's he heard from that apartment was today, and about five minutes, he heard a male yelling and knocking on his door. He did not open his door to see what was going on. But he did hear a lot of screaming about the last five, ten minutes ago. Prior to that, he has not heard any issues from next door. He does not know his neighbors very well and rarely ever sees them. It is usually quiet in the apartment complex, that's why he likes living her and is not aware of any situation. He believes his neighbor is a mid-age male that lives there. He's never had a problem with him.

- She was made aware that her uncle, Frederick, had killed himself last week.
- She and her entire family have been dealing with the situation and making plans for funeral arrangements, etc.
- She and her family have also been cleaning out Frederick's house this week.
- This evening she was made aware that her other uncle, Ronnie, had been killed.
- She knows that Ronnie and Frederick were brothers.
- Ronnie has always been "crazy."
- Ronnie often goes "nuts."
- Ronnie has been this way his whole life.
- She thought that the circumstances surrounding Fredrick's death were very unusual.
- She did not know Frederick ever to be suicidal and did not believe that he was capable of killing himself.
- As she and her family were cleaning out his belongings, they found a receipt which indicated that he had recently purchased \$200 worth of groceries the day before his death.
- They also learned that he had recently paid his car payment and also applied for a home mortgage loan
- She believes that if Frederick truly was thinking about killing himself he would have not completed these tasks.
- She also remembers Ronnie stating that he had killed Frederick.
- Ronnie stated this several times to the family while they were dealing with the initial aftermath of Frederick's death.

- After she found out that Ronnie had been killed this evening, she and the entire family began suspecting that Ronnie may have also killed Frederick.
- They believe that Frederick had owed Ronnie money at some point and time.

As I took a statement from Brenda Lewis she was extremely upset given the fact that her other uncle Ronnie had recently been killed. She was crying the majority of the statement that I took from her and advised that she was not able to drive to make a face-to-face statement.

I contacted Sergeant R. Roushar, Badge 120, and updated him with the information that I had received.

Your Affiant is conducting a death investigation related to an officer-involved shooting in the City of Crystal, MN. The deceased was identified as Ronald Lee Klitzka DOB 11/20/54.

On Friday, November 10, 2017, Ronald Klitzka, a resident in Crystal Minnesota, called 911 from cellular phone number 763-226-3694 and spoke to Hennepin County Dispatch. Klitzka stated that he wanted to be killed by the police and that he would come out of his residence and shoot everyone. Klitzka stated that he was a homicidal maniac in control of guns and is going to shoot everyone he sees.

A short time later, Klitzka's sister called 911 and spoke Hennepin County Dispatch. The sister stated she was on the phone her brother Klitzka who told her that he was going to commit suicide.

A few minutes later, Nicole Ballingrud, a Registered Nurse, called 911 and spoke to Hennepin County Dispatch. Ballingrud stated that she received a phone call from Ronald Klitzka who told her he was going to shoot the police when they arrived, that he was going to have a "western shootout" with the police and that he has an arsenal of assault weapons and that he wants to die by self-inflicted gunshot or by the police.

Later, Klitzka did come out of his residence and did discharge a weapon on one occasion. A short time later, police officers on perimeter observed Klitzka waiving around a handgun in the garage and driveway area of his residence. Klitzka then fired off another round from his gun and officers shot Klitzka.

It was also learned that Klitzka was placed on a 72-hour health and welfare hold at North Memorial hospital a few days prior. This incident was triggered by Klitzka's discovery of his brother's suicide the same week.

Your Affiant received a black KYOCERA push to talk cellular flip phone that the Medical Examiner retrieved from the decedent's pants pocket.

Your Affiant believes that there may be digital evidence contained within the black KYOCERA push to talk cellular flip phone that could lead to the discovery of possible witnesses or other person that Klitzka may have contacted within the time frame of the incident.

Your Affiant is aware through training and experience that cellular phones contain call records, photographs, text messages that are stored within that cellular phone. Your Affiant knows that a forensic examination of the black KYOCERA push to talk cellular phone could reveal information pertinent to Klitzka's state of mind at the time of the incident. Such data



In this capacity, you affiant has received training relevant to general investigations and is working with experienced investigators. Working in this capacity, you affiant has received the following information he believes to be true and correct.

Your affiant is conducting a death investigation related to an officer-involved shooting in the City of Crystal. The deceased was initially identified as Ronald Lee Klitzka DOB 11/20/1954.

On 11/10/2017, multiple law enforcement agencies responded to the address of 5128 Angeline Avenue North in Crystal on a report of a suicidal male. The male had called 911 and stated he wanted to be shot by the police. Other witnesses called 911 and reported the male had multiple guns to his head. At the time of the calls there were other witnesses in the home, including at least one adult and child.

Officers responded to the area and established a perimeter around the scene. While officers neared the house the male is reported to have stated he was armed and yelled he was going to kill himself. The male was reported to have fired at least one shot from within the garage of the residence. The male called 911 and stated he "will shoot everyone he sees."

As officers were watching the male, they noted he was seen in the garage with a gun in his hand. According to dispatch notes, the male fired additional rounds and was shot by officers. Officers approached the scene and confirmed the male was shot.

As part of the investigation, your affiant learned that the male was recently placed on a 72-hour health and welfare hold at North Memorial hospital following an altercation with Brooklyn Park PD. This incident was triggered by Klitzka's discovery of his brother's suicide. Your affiant has also learned that there is documentation of the male receiving mental health treatment from the Veteran's Affairs Medical Center. Your affiant learned the male had a history of suicidal ideation and mental health problems. 

**OBSERVATIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS** 

The following incident occurred in the attached garage of a single-family dwelling.

Ronald Klitzka lay prone on the garage floor. His head was facedown. His left eye and mouth were partially open. His right eye was closed. Klitzka's hands were behind his back secured with two sets of handcuffs. His hands were open. Klitzka's feet were straight out from his body with his ankles crossed. He was wearing a camo jacket, grey sweatshirt, white t-shirt, jeans, black socks and brown shoes. His left shoe was partially removed from his foot. Klitzka was wearing an inner belt and outer belt each with a gun holster. The outer most holster was attached to his right thigh with a string. Klitzka had two magazines with an unknown number of cartridges in his back left pants pocket. He also had a magazine with an unknown number of cartridges and one cartridge in his front left pants pocket.

There was severe trauma to Klitzka's head. An area of blood-like substance (BLS) was on the garage floor next to Klitzka. There were areas of BLS on Klitzka's head, face, t-shirt, sweatshirt and jacket. There was suspected brain tissue on the garage floor.

Less lethal ammunition (EM 7) was on the garage floor underneath Klitzka. A bullet fragment (EM 6) was on the garage floor next to Klitzka. Several bullet fragments (EM 8) were on the floor in the back of the garage. Also inside the garage, a cartridge case (EM 11) marked "45 Auto" and bullet fragments (EM 17) were by a side door leading outside.

A set of mounted cabinets lined the back of the garage. The centermost cabinet had three bullet defects. Inside the cabinet a bullet fragment was inside a metal toolbox. A bullet (EM 19) was imbedded in the back of the cabinet wall. Bullet fragments (EM 20) were on a set of tools inside the bottom shelf of the cabinet.

A ballistic shield was on the ground on the driveway. An orange Remington 870 shotgun bearing # W310568M (EM 5) was on the ground on the driveway. A shotshell marked "12" was removed from the chamber and two shotshells marked "12" were removed from the tube of the shotgun.

On the driveway next to the stairs of the home, three handguns were on the ground. The first was a black 9 mm Ruger LC9, with a functioning laser sight, bearing # 323-43833 (EM 2). A magazine with an unknown number of cartridges (EM 9) was seated in the pistol bearing # 323-43833. A cartridge marked "9mm Luger FC" was in the

chamber of the pistol bearing # 323-43833. The second was a black, 45 Ruger Vaquero revolver, bearing # 57-03978 (EM 3) with six cartridges marked "45 Colt CBC" seated in the chambers of the cylinder. The third handgun was a silver, 45 Smith and Wesson 1911 pistol, bearing # NM 381540 (EM 4) with an attached laser sight that was not functioning. A magazine (EM 10) with an unknown number of cartridges, was seated in the pistol bearing # NM 381540. A cartridge marked "45 Auto" was in the chamber of the pistol bearing # NM 381540.

A fired shotshell, (EM 1) was in the grass in front of the home.

On the east side of 5127 Angeline Ave N, a Remington 700 bearing # S6281276 (EM 15) was on the grass. A cartridge marked "308 WIN Match Kinetic" was in the chamber of the rifle. Two cartridges marked "308 WIN Match Kinetic" (EM 14) were on the ground next to the rifle. An ammo pouch containing three cartridges marked "308 WIN Match Kinetic" (EM 21) were attached to the stock end of the rifle. A cartridge case marked "308 WIN Match Kinetic" (EM 12), a scope cover (EM 13) and a backpack containing tactical gear and ammunition (EM 16) were on the ground.

In the backyard of 5123 Angeline Ave N, a range finder and case (EM 18) were on the ground.

Hennepin County Medical Examiner's Office Investigator Burkhalter arrived on scene at 0036 hours and took custody of Klitzka (17-6687).



Comparative examinations of Item 11 (a 45 Auto caliber cartridge case) against cartridge cases test fired in Item 4 showed the presence of matching features. This means that Item 11 was fired in Item 4.


