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**The Juvenile Court has jurisdiction by reason of the following allegations:** The above-named juvenile is alleged to be delinquent pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 260B.007, Subd. 6(1) because said child has violated a state/local law as follows:

**Count 1: A2235 Assault-2nd Degree-Dangerous Weapon (Felony)**

**MINN. STAT. 609.222.1, 609.222.1, 609.11.4, 609.101.2**

That on or about 11/5/2019, at a school located at 4001 West 102nd Street, City of Bloomington, Hennepin County, Minnesota, Anika Daisy Quittschreiber, assaulted an identified female student, while using a dangerous weapon.

## PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

Your Petitioner is an Assistant County Attorney. In that capacity, Petitioner believes the facts and circumstances recited below establish probable cause:

On November 5, 2019, at approximately 12:00 p.m., the school resource police officer at Jefferson High School (4001 West 102nd Street, City of Bloomington, Hennepin County, Minnesota) responded to a student fight inside the school at the main entrance. Immediately upon arrival, the officer observed and heard an identified female student (“Victim” herein), yelling that she had been stabbed. The officer observed at least one wound to Victim’s abdomen that was actively bleeding, and noted that there was blood flowing onto the floor. C.R., a school staff member, was escorting another student ANIKA DAISY QUITTSCHREIBER (“Respondent” herein) to the school office. Police asked Respondent where the knife was, and Respondent indicated that it was under her clothing. Police ultimately recovered a Viper-Tech knife from Respondent’s person. The knife was approximately nine inches long with a black-colored handle and a four-inch blade; there was a blood-like substance on it.

Victim spoke with police briefly as paramedics treated her wounds, Victim reported that she was in a fist with Respondent when Victim realized she had been stabbed. Victim admitted to starting the fight over something stupid, further detailing that she and Respondent do not like each other and that they have fought before. The interview had to be cut short so paramedics could take Victim to a hospital for further treatment of her wounds. Police later learned that Victim had two separate stab wounds just below her left breast, one stab wound to her upper chest, one stab wound to her upper left thigh and two stab wounds to

her left forearm. In addition, one of the stab wounds nicked Victim's lung, requiring the insertion of a chest tube.

Video surveillance footage of the incident that showed the following. Respondent walks through the main door and down the hallway with both hands in her sweatshirt pocket. Victim walks towards Respondent and they appear to exchange words as they approach one another. Respondent removes her left hand from her sweatshirt pocket, keeping the right hand concealed. Victim swings her fist at Respondent and punches her on the left side of her head. Respondent immediately pulls her right hand —wielding a knife— from her sweatshirt pocket and begins to swing the knife at Victim in an upward stabbing motion four to six times. The two students wrestle each other to the ground. School staff break up the fight within 10 seconds; escorting Victim to nearby hallway and Respondent to the office.

The offense enumerated in Count 1 is a presumptive prison offense.

PURSUANT TO M.S. 260B.125, THE STATE IS MOVING, BY SEPARATE MOTION, THAT THIS PROCEEDING BE CERTIFIED TO THE DISTRICT COURT FOR ACTION UNDER THE CRIMINAL LAWS.
