The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Damage to Property - 1st Degree - Foreseeable Risk Bodily Harm

Minnesota Statute: 609.595.1(1)

Maximum Sentence: 0-5 YEARS AND/OR \$10,000

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 12/27/2019

Control #(ICR#): 19017013

Charge Description: That on or about 12/27/2019, in Hennepin County, Minnesota, LARRY DRANEAIL RADUENZ Jr intentionally caused damage to physical property belonging to (victim), without (victim)'s consent and such damage caused a reasonably foreseeable risk of bodily harm.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Complainant has investigated the facts and circumstances of this offense and believes the following establishes probable cause:

Deputy Trombley responded to North Memorial Hospital at 3300 Oakdale Avenue North located in Robbinsdale, Hennepin County, Minnesota on 12-27-2019 on a report of the valve supplying the main pipeline of oxygen to all the patients at the Hospital being shut off by a male suspect later identified as Larry Draneail Raduenz, Jr., Defendant herein.

Video surveillance from that date showed the suspect, Defendant herein, at 6:16:51 am walking through the atrium area of the hospital, approaching a television that was on and unplugging same with a good video of the suspect's face. At 6:20:06, Defendant is observed walking through sliding glass doors and then proceeding to walk on the sidewalk in his distinct hat and jacket, the direction of travel which will bring him to the Oxygen Tank area which is behind fencing. At 6:21:09, Defendant is observed crossing Oakdale. At 6:21:47, he video shows the area where the hospital's oxygen supply is kept and Defendant is observed coming from Oakdale to the fenced portion containing oxygen tanks for North Memorial. At 6:23:24, Defendant emerges from behind the west side of the main oxygen tank, stumbles, regains his footing outside the fence, then walks around the oxygen tank and walks out of camera view, heading west toward Bottineau Boulevard. Engineer J.M.T. advised that at approximately 0627, he was called to check the main valves to the oxygen tank, the pressure was dropping rapidly. At 6:31, the Hospital's Engineer's staff are observed going to the same area that Defendant had just been, but entering through the gate on the sidewalk. The valves were held open by zip ties and stainless latches, both of which were broken off. J.M.T. said that they were happy to find the problem fast. If it would have taken much longer, the oxygen would have depleted and could have caused injury or death to multiple patients. J.M.T. said it would've taken a lot of effort to break the zip ties and latches. North Memorial gave no one consent to sabotage their patients' oxygen supply via this damage.

Your complainant reviewed said video and law enforcement databases and comparing the security video/photos to know photo's of Raduenz, determined them to be a match.

Your complainant is also aware that Defendant was convicted on 9/17/2019, of Damage to Property for cutting cable from a gas meter to the information sending device in St. Cloud, Stearns County, MN on October 6, 2018, 73-CR-19-1503.

Defendant was arrested at a shelter in St. Paul on 2/5/2020 and in a digitally recorded interview per Miranda admitted to being angry with the hospital and frequenting the premises in Robbinsdale. Defendant initially stated that he did not tamper with the oxygen tank, but then later stated that he may have done it. Defendant also stated that he heard from Deputies that metal clips and black zip ties were broken on the oxygen tank. However, had there been contact with deputies on prior occasion, they would have earlier arrested Defendant, which did not occur.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
