Secondly, I along with several other Officers went to NMMC to secure the original 911 caller/assault victim (Rayanne), and the two witness paramedics. Once there, I had one Officer stay with Rayanne the entire time, until relieved by an investigator. Next, I had two separate squads transport the Hennepin County paramedics to room 108 for interviews.

Lastly, I had squad 510 tow the HCMC ambulance to the MPLS Impound lot forensic garage for processing.

After clearing the hospital I returned to the scene on Plymouth Ave and was released soon after by IC Sgt. McBride.

I also observed that Officer Schwarze and Ringgenberg were on the south side of the street. There were other officers that had arrived before us assisting with that scene.

At that time, I began to keep the crowd back from where the officers were dealing with the gun shot victim. The crowd kept trying to advance into the street towards the officers. I called out on the radio that we needed more officers for crowd control, and also that we needed to close traffic on Plymouth Av.

Officers were eventually able to make a line of officers and contain the crowd to the sidewalk. Crime scene tape was then put up. Officers then directed everyone from in front of the Elks club to leave the area. It should be noted that there were several uncooperative people in the crowd. Also several people in the crowd were video taping the situation.

Once the area on the north side of scene was secure, I went to the south side which had fewer officers to secure the area. There were numerous people in the doorways and balconies of the apartment building on the south side of the street that were yelling at officers and very upset. I stood by near Plymouth and Knox and secured the perimeter at this location for the remainder of the time on scene.

We were informed that they needed the street of Plymouth blocked, because of the large group and need some officers to the north of Plymouth Av. I arrived on the scene and parked just north of Plymouth Av on Knox. I then exited my squad, and went up to the scene to see where they needed help for the event. I was asked to assist with dispersing the crowd of well over a hundred plus people, and direct them north away from Plymouth and away from the scene. I then asked him, if there were any weapons we needed to locate from the suspect possibly on the scene? Off Ringgenberg told me, "No, but I lost my squad key." Off Ringgenberg was concerned that someone else would find the key and possibly take a squad car. I asked Off Ringgenberg if he fired any shots, and he told me he did not.

I then communicated this information to Sgt Campbell at the scene, because I was unable to get ahold of Sgt McBride. Sgt Campbell informed me he would get ahold of Sgt McBride and pass on the information. This information was then later communicated to Lt Zimmerman of the Homicide Unit as well.

I then stayed at the 4th Pct, where both Off Ringgenberg and Off Schwarze were kept separate. I stayed with them until: Homicide, IAU, Off Fitch of the Federation, Sgt Hagel of the Peer Debriefing Team, Car 21, the nurse and Off Kelly of the Range came and spoke with both of them. I spoke with Off Fitch of the Federation, and informed him they will want to have Car 21 collect Off Ringgenbergs gun belt and weapon, for processing from the event for DNA. This was then collected by Car 21 after both officers were photographed.

After the officers were spoken to, they asked if their squad was back at the station so they could grab their gear and leave for the night. Off Fitch and I, went out to the scene and grabbed their possessions for them. Their squad car was being photographed and video recorded by Car 21. When we were able to, Off Fitch gathered their property and we brought it back to the 4th Pct and gave it to each of them. Both officers were then allowed to leave the precinct for the night.

When the officers left the precinct, I was then able to clear the station and complete my report.

After the crime scene had been made larger I assisted in guarding the scene until I cleared to handle other priority calls in the city.

On 11/15/2015 at approximately 0050 hours while working marked squad 505 in my capacity as a 5th precinct dogwatch supervisor, I heard dispatch tone an "Officer Needs Help" call at 1611 Plymouth AV N and then air that shots had been fired. I then heard squads on scene asking for all available units to respond due to a large unruly group on scene. At that point I responded to that location to assist.

When I arrived I observed multiple groups of people on the apartment balconies, street corners, in the entryway of the apartment building, and on their porches. Many of these parties were screaming obscenities at officers and appeared to me to be very upset. I spoke with officers who were standing on the sidewalk in front of 1611 Plymouth AV N, who informed me that the scene was in the grassy boulevard directly in front of the building.

At that point I was approached by Sgt T Campbell, who requested that I handle the scene in front of the apartment building and ensure that its integrity was maintained. I then directed the officers who were in the immediate area to spread out down the sidewalk between James AV N and Knox AV N and make sure that no one enters the crime scene or otherwise tries to interfere.

A short time later I directed Officers W Martin and A Womble to do a canvass of the townhomes that are connected to, but are to the west of the 1611 Plymouth AV N apartment building. They were directed to get names of the occupants of the townhomes and whether or not they witnessed the incident in any way. Once they completed that task Officer Martin told me that one of the females that his partner spoke to (Nekelia Sharp reported that she witnessed the incident. I later passed this information along to Sgt Green, who was the investigator on scene.

I then assigned a group of officers to go into 1611 Plymouth AV N and knock on every apartment door to see if there was anyone who had seen what occurred. The officers returned a short time later and informed me that they were unable to find anyone inside who was willing to talk to them about the incident.

I continued to monitor the situation around 1611 Plymouth AV N. At one point a large group of angry people arrived and stood near the east side of the apartment building shouting at officers. The group was very upset and two of the members were attempting to antagonize officers, so I directed Officer Yang to position his squad car so that it was facing the group and to activate the squad MVR. This was done with marked squad 423.

I was later approached by Sgt Green, who requested that Sharp be transported to room 108 to be interviewed. I went with Officer Martin to the townhome where Sharp was when they spoke with her and attempted to make contact with her. We were informed that she had went home to 1611 Plymouth AV N #103. Officer Martin and I made contact with her there. I explained to her that it was important to the investigation that she come with us to room 108 to be interviewed by investigators. She adamantly refused, even after I explained to her that she would be provided with transportation there and back and that we could arrange for someone to take care of her children. She continued to refuse and told me that she was not interested in talking to the police again. She then disappeared into the apartment and refused to talk with me anymore.

On the above date and time I was driving marked squad 403 (with call sign 407). At approximately 0054 hours, I heard squad 424 air "Shots fired.....one down!". This was followed shortly by other officers airing to the effect, "We need every clear squad in the city to the scene". Officers aired that a large, hostile group had formed and officers needed help to control the crowd.

At the time, I was at 4211 James Av N on a SHOTS call (see CCN 15-423388). I had checked the area and not located any suspects or evidence. I then immediately responded to the HELP call Code 3.

Approximately 5-6 blocks out, I announced on air that I was the Incident Commander and would be arriving. Upon arrival, I observed approximately 15 squad cars on Plymouth Av with groups of people on both sides of the street. The groups appeared extremely hostile as they were yelling "Fuck the police!" and that they hated us. The Ames Elk Lodge at 1614 Plymouth Av N had approximatley 50-100 people exiting it. Many from the Lodge joined the hostile groups. When we had enough officers on scene we then began directing the groups to leave.

I asked officers on scene if this was a shots call or an officer involved shooting. Officers informed me they believed it was an officer involved shooting. I then asked where the involved and witness officers were. The officers I spoke to did not know. I then checked with different officers on scene. Officer Sworski informed me that squad 424 was the involved squad and that he had brought the officers to the station as it was too chaotic and a hostile scene. The precinct is only a few blocks from the incident location.

Numerous sergeants were arriving from other precincts. I located Sgt. Suker and asked him to go to the precinct to get the Public Safety Statement from the Involved/Witness Officers. I did so because I was the Incident Commander and could not leave my location with an unsecure, hostile scene. I also asked Sgt. Suker to make sure he had escort sergeants for the Involved and Witness Officers. Sgt. Suker did so as I stayed on scene.

Car 9, Lt. Novak, arrived on scene. I informed him of the Officer Involved Shooting and asked him to send a VIP page out. Lt. Novak did so.

I then asked Sgt. Kris Brown to start getting yellow crime scene tape up to protect the scene. He took a large group of officers and did so. The large number of Elks Lodge customers were steadily leaving the club and yelling obscenities at officers. I asked Senior Officer Lewis to try to locate witnesses that may have seen the event. He stated he would try but many were very hostile and were refusing to talk to police.

I then located Sgt. Pucely. I asked him to start checking for witnesses at the apartment complex on the 1601 block side of Plymouth. He stated he would have to take a group of officers due to the fact residents and vistors at this location were very hostile and agressive to officers. I asked him to knock on every door and document each address.

I then checked the entire perimeter of the scene making sure crime scene tape was up and that we had an adequate number of officers to keep the scene secure and safe. We blocked off over 2 blocks on Plymouth Av N.

I asked Sgt. Rivard to manage street resources (911 calls in the precinct). She did so.

SICM was contacted. There is a street camera at Plymouth Av N/Knox Av N. Officer Krekelberg stated the initial incident does not appear to be captured but the aftermath with the large, hostile groups were.

I was then informed that an assault victim had been transported to NMMC by a HCMC rig. I was also informed that another rig had taken the suspect to HCMC to be treated. I was informed Officer Badowich was in the

I then located Sgt. Campbell and asked him to go to NMMC with some officers and make sure the assault

victim was still there and to secure her. Sgt. Campbell did so. I was later informed the victim had a broken ankle and swollen lip.

I also asked Sgt. Campbell to secure, separate, both HCMC witness paramedics. I asked Sgt. Campbell to make arrangements to transport the HCMC paramedics to be interviewed in Room 108.

I then contacted Officer Badowich. Officer Badowich rode in the ambulance with suspect. I asked for a status update. Officer Badowich stated suspect had been shot once above the eye and was not expected to make it. He stated HCMC bagged up suspect's clothes. I informed him to secure the clothes until it could be given to Car 21.

I was then briefed that a witness was present who on scene when the event happened. This witness was HCMC Deputy Chief of Operations Public Information Officer Mike Trullinger. W/Trullinger then briefed me. He explained to me that HCMC EMS was on scene treating an assault victim when the suspect showed up. He stated the suspect claimed to be the victim's son but they believed he was not. I asked why he did not think the suspect was the victim's son and he explained that the victim had said that she did not know him and that he had assaulted her. He stated that victim was in the EMS rig and that the suspect then began to pound on the exterior of the rig to be let in. He stated that EMS then called for a squad Code 3 fearing for their safety. He stated that EMS felt safe in their rig but needed a squad to deal with suspect. He then stated that the squad arrived and he could hear the officers saying they needed suspect to show his hands. He stated that he could hear the suspect demanding to know why the officers had their guns out. He stated that the officers then had the suspect against the rig (in a frisk type of way) and then suspect began to flail his arms and struggled with officers. He stated that shortly after he heard a gunshot and they (EMS) then tried to cover the victim to protect her and then they took off as soon as they could. He stated that the victim was taken by a HCMC rig to NMMC and the suspect was taken to HCMC by another rig with an officer. He also stated that there is a video camera on the rear of the ambulance and that the event may be captured on video. I then contacted Sgt. Campbell and informed him we needed to secure the EMS rig. He did so.

Throughout this time a hostile group was still on scene yelling profanities at officers. They then broke our crime scene tape. I then asked officers to make the scene bigger. We then escorted the group further back and used a fence to help secure the scene with crime scene tape.

Car 710, Sgt. Green arrived on scene. I walked Sgt. Green through the scene and briefed him. When showing where the event unfolded, Sgt. Green asked if the event was captured on squad video. I then opened squad 424, P#76679, and turned on the MVR. There were no recordings on it. I informed Sgt. Green of this. I also informed him of the EMS rig potential video and suspect's DNA on the outside of it. Sgt. Green asked the EMS rig be towed inside the forensics garage. I then relayed this request to Sgt. Campbell. I also asked Sgt. Campbell to have the officer with victim (Officer Andress) stay with her until interviewed. I was later informed the victim was going to be admitted and that Car 710 was going to NMMC to interview her.

IAU Sgts, Prescott and Schmidt, arrived on scene. I briefed them and walked them through the scene.

Car 21 arrived on scene and processed it.

We then drove squad 424 and HCMC's supervisor car to the precinct as he was still down in Room 108.

Once the scene was cleared I went back to the station to do reports. Sgt. Green asked me to double check the MVR of 424. I did so. Again it was operating fine and there were no files on it. Sgt. Green asked me how a MVR gets downloaded. I informed him that there are download servers at the 4th Pct Station. When a squad is at the station it automatically downloads. I checked Visinet to see if squad 424 had just come to the station prior to the assault/EMS call. The squad did so for approximately 10-20 minutes which would download MVR files. I then checked in the "Digital Evidence Series" computer application to review MVR. At 1619 hours it shows both officers following protocol at the beginning of their shift announcing the date, officers, call sign, and p#. At 1827 and 1951 hours, it shows MVR activations. These were saved as 90 Day Retention files. B of I should be notified to change these to Significant Events to save the video and show the MVR was properly working/recording.

On 11/15/15 Lt. Zimmerman contacted me and requested I respond to MPD Headquarters room 108 regarding incident 15-423385 an officer involve shooting. Upon arrival I met with Lt. Zimmerman, Sgt. Villella where I was briefed on the circumstances of this incident.

Sgt. Villella advised me that the Hennepin County Ambulance, #419, involved in this case was towed and transported to the MPD Forensic Garage. I contacted Hennepin County Deputy Chief of Operations, Chad with regard to obtaining video from the ambulance and Chief Dotzler agreed to meet me at the Forensic Garage where he would pull the hard drive from the recorder and copy the video.

I went to the MPD Forensic Garage and met with Car 21. HCMC Chief Dotzler arrived and retrieved the hard drive from inside the ambulance. HCMC Chief Dotzler then downloaded and copied video footage from Ambulance #419 and Ambulance #443 (male shot - transport ambulance) onto a red flash drive. Cameras from ambulance #419 include the rear outside camera and the inside front camera which displays through the front windshield. Deputy Chief Bruce Folkens was present at the time the video was downloaded and received a сору.

I then requested Car 21 to take overall photos of the ambulance as well as fingerprint and DNA swabs of the rear door areas, side door areas, and passenger door. See Car 21 supplement for details.

I signed an impound release form for Ambulance #419; contacted Laurie at HCMC Operations and requested she send an HCMC employee authorized to retrieve the ambulance. HCMC personnel arrived to the Forensic Garage and took possession of the ambulance and it was driven from the Forensic Garage.

In this capacity, SERGEANTS' duties include, but are not limited to, investigations involving murders, suspicious deaths, aggravated assaults, kidnapping, robberies and critical incidents.

On 11/14/2015, SERGEANTS were both assigned as on-duty MPD HOMICIDE UNIT ON-CALL INVESTIGATORS. At approximately 0115 hours, SERGEANT VILLELLA was contacted by LT. ZIMMERMAN, who advised SERGEANTS to respond to Plymouth Avenue North & James Avenue North, Minneapolis, Hennepin County, Minnesota, for a Critical Incident, Officer Involved shooting, where a Minneapolis Police Officer fired at a suspect, whose injuries were reported to be life-threatening. (Reference MPD Incident Detail Report in VISINET 15-423384).

On 11/14/2015, at approximately 0151 hours, SERGEANT GREEN responded to Plymouth Avenue North & James Avenue North, and observed MPD marked squads and uniformed personnel in the area. Yellow crime scene tape was used to establish a large perimeter in, and around, the streets and sidewalks on Plymouth Avenue North. SERGEANT GREEN provided OFFICER RODIN with information for the Crime Scene Entry Log.

SERGEANT GREEN met with SERGEANT S. MCBRIDE, the scene Incident Commander, who advised that there was one shot fired, in a downward direction, and there were no suspects at large. Responding Officers conducted a neighborhood canvass for witness(es) to the shooting. SERGEANT GREEN learned from SERGEANT J. PUCELY that a female, identified as NEKELIA SHARP, reported she witnessed the shooting. SERGEANT GREEN requested NEKELIA SHARP be transported to the MPD VCID for a witness interview. SERGEANT PUCELY advised attempts to have NEKELIA SHARP interviewed further for this investigation was not successful.

There was an inner perimeter established approximately mid-block, on the south side of Plymouth Avenue, encompassing an area in the front/north side of 1611 Plymouth Avenue North. Inside the inner perimeter, on the grass boulevard between the east/west sidewalk and the Plymouth Avenue, there were several items of potential evidentiary value.

This area of Minneapolis is primarily mixed residential single family housing and multi-unit housing structures. On the south side of Plymouth Avenue, from James Avenue North-Knox Avenue North, there is a large multi-unit housing complex. On the eastside of the complex there is a 3 story housing structure, identified as 1611 Plymouth Avenue North, with apartments 101-104, 201-204, and 301-304. On each of the three floors, there are several units on the north side of the structure with north facing windows and balconies. To the west side of the front door at 1611 Plymouth Avenue North, there are individual single family two-story units, identified east to west as 1611, 1617, 1619, 1621, 1623, and 1625. Each of the single family two-story units has north facing front doors and windows.

On the north side of Plymouth Avenue, James Avenue North-Knox Avenue North, there is a one story building occupied by the AMES LODGE #106 MINNEHAHA TEMPLE #129 I.B.P.O ELKS OF WORLD, located at 1614 Plymouth Avenue North. The building has a single glass door on the south side, facing south across Plymouth Avenue. There is a fixed video surveillance camera on the southeast corner of the building, directed northeast, and a rotating video surveillance camera on the northeast corner of the building.

SERGEANT GREEN conferred with a Club Member, identified as JEFFEREY BYRD, # who showed SERGEANT GREEN the viewing monitor for the video surveillance system. A Club Member, identified as JAMES MARCUS FRIERSON, # advised SERGEANT GREEN that the video surveillance system was operational; however, the system could not be accessed by him at the time. Arrangements were made with JAMES FRIERSON to have MPD CRIME LAB Personnel attempt to retrieve the video surveillance

Lupkes told their supervisor was administering care to the patient. Lupkes told they were in the grassy area between the sidewalk and the street. Lupkes told at that time it was decided to load the patient up and get him out of the area. Hill described the patient as being a black male, a little bit taller than 5'5, thin to lean built, wearing baggy clothing, red plaid boxers on baggy jeans, black zip-up sweatshirt, quilted jacket, possibly a red t-shirt on, but doesn't recall the color, and 24 years of age.

Hill told she did not see any weapons lying by the patient and her partner had asked officers if the patient had been search. Hill told she felt on the patient for weapons and did not find a weapon on him.

Hill described the scene as dark and not well lit.

Haskell told this female told she hurt her ankle because she had broken up an altercation about an hour prior to calling EMS. Haskell told at that time the female did not tell them who the fight was between.

As they were leaving the building entrance with the female who was in a transport chair, they noticed a male crying and acting kind of odd. Haskell's partner asked this male if he was okay and they male didn't respond and looked away. As they continued walking towards the ambulance the female told them that was the male who had did this to her. Haskell describes this male as being African American, 5'8, long dreads, wearing black sweatshirt, black pants.

Haskell told they continued to walk towards the ambulance with the female. Haskell told his partner got on the radio and requested police officers to respond with lights and sirens because the assailant was on scene.

Haskell told as they were trying to get the female onto their stretcher the male he had previously described walked up to them and was asking where she was going, in case he wanted to come and see her. Haskell's partner told him to back off and to let her be at this time. Haskell describes this male as being about 3 feet away from them and his partner kept telling this male to back up and stay away. Haskell told the female patient told this male to please stop and she didn't say anything else to him.

Haskell told the female claimed that she didn't know him, but the male kept claiming he was her son. The female denied that this male was her son. Haskell told the female told them this male was not related to her.

Haskell described the male as calling his partner "A pussy," "A Little Bitch." Haskell told his partner got on the radio again and asked for police to respond Code 3, that the assailant is standing around them.

Haskell told they got into the ambulance and while doing patient care and waiting for the police to arrive the male this whole time was knocking on the back window and was trying to open the door.

Haskell told that his supervisor arrived and parked behind their ambulance. Haskell heard the supervisor talking to the male, telling the male to relax, that they were just checking things out and making sure everything is okay here. Haskell told he unlocked the doors so the supervisor could get into their ambulance. Haskell told the supervisor got into the ambulance and he asked the supervisor to re-lock the ambulance doors.

Haskell told her never observed the police arrive. As they were talking to the supervisor and were getting ready

to leave the scene that is when they heard the one shot being fired.

Haskell described after hearing the gun shot he hit his emergency help button on. Haskell told the supervisor got on the radio and aired shots fired and they needed help over the radio and they all got down on the floor of the ambulance.

Haskell told the supervisor got out of the ambulance and his partner got out of the ambulance to get into the driver seat to drive out of the scene. Haskell told the supervisor stayed behind.

Haskell told he did not see anything outside between the police and the male outside. Told he did not hear them say anything and all he heard was a gun shot. Haskell told he heard talking outside, but did not hear what was being said and did not hear any screaming until after the gun shot and then heard a bunch of people screaming, but not any words.

Haskell told he does not know who was shot outside besides his partner telling him it was the guy they originally had the altercation with.

Haskell told the lighting in the area was dark, except for the ambulance lighting.

Haskell told there were 5 to 6 people outside and across the street at the bar area had 10 to 12 people outside.

Haskell told he never observed weapons on this male, but told this male had his hands in his pockets a lot.

Haskell told it appeared the female had been hit in the face a few times.

Haskell told they transported this female to North Memorial Hospital and identified the female as Rayann Hayes.

Haskell told they had been parked facing eastbound on Plymouth and the ambulance side door was on the boulevard side. Haskell told he heard the shot coming from that area.

Thompson told he works for Hennepin County Medical Center - EMS.

Thompson told he and his partner/Haskell responded to 1611 Plymouth Avenue North, apartment 204, on a medical miscellaneous that the patient had been assaulted when breaking up a fight that occurred one hour ago. Thompson told the call came in at 0020 hours on 11/15/15 and arrived at 0025 hours. Thompson told the run number is 15076386.

Thompson told upon arrival they parked facing eastbound on the northside of the building. Thompson told they went to the apartment 204 and located an African American female, 5'6, 100 lbs, in her 40's, last name Hayes. Thompson told the family was sleeping and there were kids in the house and a teenage son.

Thompson told he observed the female had a hurt right ankle, had abrasions to her nose and a cut lip. Thompson told this female told him that her injuries occurred when she was in the hallway and while trying to break up a fight.

Thompson told they used a stair chair to get her down the stairs and down to the ambulance. Thompson told as they got outside of the door of the building. Thompson told a male was crying. Thompson described this male as being African American male, wearing all black clothing, having dreads and is crying. Thompson asked this male if he was okay.

Thompson told the female stated to them that is the guy that did this to me. Thompson told this male later told them that he was the females son.

Thompson told while they were getting the female onto a stretcher, the male was approaching them and because the female had told them that this was the person who had assaulted her Thompson got on the radio and requested a squad to respond Code 3.

Thompson told as they were loading her up on the stretcher the male approached saying he was her son and the female was telling them that the male was not her son. Thompson told this male that he needed to back up. Thompson told that this male started to call him names, calling him a bitch and saying to him "fuck you pussy." Thompson told this male then told the female that he was going to come down to see her and the female wasn't responding back to him.

Thompson told he was on the radio with dispatch telling them that they need police to arrive now. Thompson told he did not notice if the male had any weapons in his hands. Thompson told he was mainly focusing on getting the female into the ambulance. Once inside they locked the ambulance doors. Thompson described the area around the ambulance as not well lit.

Thompson told that his partner told him that the male had knocked on the back door. Thompson told they were staying inside the ambulance and waiting for help to arrive.

Thompson told the supervisor arrives behind them and parks his vehicle facing westbound and they can see this through their rear door windows. Thompson observes the supervisor have a conversation with the male outside, but he cannot hear what is being said. Thompson told he could hear over his radio that the supervisor had ordered the squads Code 3.

Thompson told that the supervisor came into the ambulance and they have a brief conversation about who the

male is outside and who is he to her.

Thompson told he did not observe the police arrive, but believes they were there because he knows that the supervisor would not have come into the ambulance leaving a strange man outside the ambulance.

At the time they are getting ready to go they heard a loud pop outside. Thompson told he knows its gun fire in a close proximity. Thompson told he heard one shot. Thompson told he called on the main "shots fired" and the supervisor hit his email button.

Thompson told he and his supervisor went out the side door and he observed two officers outside and the assailant who they had been dealing with laying out on the ground on his back. Thompson told as he coming around the front he observed a large crowd gathering outside. Thompson told he got into the ambulance and took off Code 3. Thompson told he heard the crowd yelling from the bar side.

Thompson did not hear any arguing outside the ambulance before he heard the shot-being fired.

Thompson told he didn't look to see if the male had any weapons.

Trullinger told he works for Hennepin County - EMS and is the duty Deputy Chief of Operations.

Trullinger told he was the supervisor on duty and told he heard ambulance truck 419 was asking for squads Code 3, but told they were Code 4 inside their truck. The personnel in truck 419 told that the suspect in the assault was trying to access into the ambulance and interfering with the care. Trullinger told this ambulance crew responded to 1611 Plymouth Avenue North.

Trullinger told that the female had an ankle injury and she had been hit in the face.

Trullinger told that he responded to the call where ambulance truck 419 was located. Trullinger told upon his arrival he observed a male at the back door of the ambulance. Trullinger aired on the radio asking the crew if this was the male they had been calling about and they confirmed that it was. Trullinger told he approached the male and he observed him looking in and tapping on the ambulance door. Trullinger told he got on the radio and asked the dispatch to get the officers to respond Code 3.

Trullinger described this male as being black, short dreads, but not real short, darker outer jacket with possibly a dark red shirt.

Trullinger told he approached this male and asked him what he wanted and the male told him that the female was his mother. Trullinger told that it appeared to him that the male was trying to forcibly make himself cry. Trullinger told the squad arrived and he walked up to one of the officers and told him this is the suspect in the assault and the person who is trying to gain access into the ambulance and he asked that they talk to this male as he wanted to talk to his crew.

Trullinger told that as he and the two officers were approaching the male. Trullinger told that the officer he had spoken to he noticed that he had drew his weapon and was holding the gun at his low ready. Trullinger told that the officer asked if the male had any weapons on him and the male responded no. Trullinger told that he heard the male ask the officer why he had his gun out and it sounded like the male was getting a little uppity. Trullinger could tell that this male was getting verbal and there were people yelling stuff.

Trullinger told there were people coming out of the Elks approximately 6 to 10 and from the apartments there were quite a number of people out there.

Trullinger told he did not see the male with any weapons, but he noticed that he would have his hands in his shirt or pockets.

Trullinger told as he approached the side door of the ambulance he looked back and it appeared that one of the officers were trying to get control of him and observed one of the officers doing an escort hold on the male.

Trullinger told he got into the ambulance and began asking the crew how everything was going and then asked the patient who the male was as he was claiming to be her son. Trullinger asked the female if this was the man that had hit her and she told him yes. Trullinger told he heard a single gun shot. Trullinger told the medics and him got down around the patient waiting to see if there were going to be any more shots, but there wasn't. Trullinger told the announced on the radio shots fired. They decided they needed to get out of there. Trullinger told he opened the door and observed two officers facing the crowd and the suspect lying on the ground and bleeding from his head.

Trullinger told his ambulance crew to get out of there and they were going to transport the female to North.

Trullinger told he went up to the male on the ground and saw that he wasn't breathing, but had a pulse. Trullinger told he went to his truck to get medical equipment and started to provide life saving measures on this male.

Trullinger told he called for a truck right away and requested fire to respond.

Trullinger told the male had a gunshot wound to his left side of his head on the temple area. While the crew arrived to assist they loaded the male into the ambulance and left the scene as a crowd was gathering. Trullinger told no weapons at that time was found on the male. Trullinger told the male was transported to HCMC.

Trullinger told he only noticed one officer with their weapon out. Trullinger told this officer was a white male, possibly blonde hair or no hair, 5'11, medium to bigger built.

Trullinger told that he did observed a pair of handcuffs lying next to the patient on the right side of him. Trullinger told the handcuffs were lying on the grass and were not on the male.

I introduced myself to Rayann Hayes and told her I was there to take a statement from her.

Rayann Hayes she lives at 1223 Morgan Avenue North and was over at her daughters house at 1611 Plymouth Avenue North, apartment 204. Rayann Hayes told that her daughter is Shamirra Finn and her daughter has a 2 year old.

Rayann Hayes told she had been drinking and had two shots and a cosmopolitan drink and had smoked marijuana today.

Hayes told she went to a birthday party at Alfred and Keylondra (sp?) apartment 103. Hayes told others were also present and they had played cards Sharice Clark, Jamar Clark who is Sharice brother and Ronnie Powell.

Hayes told that Sharice Clark lives in apartment 104 with her husband Jerome Powell.

Hayes told she has known the people that live in 103 and 104 for approximately 1 year.

Hayes told that something popped off and Alfred and Keylondra had got into an argument. Hayes wasn't sure exactly what happened and while they were inside playing cards with Alfred and Key Key.

Hayes was asked what happened to her face and leg and she told everything happened so fast. Hayes told when Alfred and Keylondra were fighting she got in between the two.

I asked Hayes about calling the paramedics for her injuries and when they were bringing her outside to the ambulance she pointed out the male responsible for causing her injuries. Hayes acknowledges telling the paramedics this. I asked her who she told was responsible for causing her injuries and she stated she told them the guy standing in front of the building. Hayes first responds that she doesn't know his name and really doesn't know him like that. Hayes then describes the male throwing her to the ground and bagging her against the floor.

I asked Hayes to describe the male and she told he is black and the one with the dread locks, short in height, dark complexion and then told it was Jamar Clark, age is middle 20's. I told her that he is saying that he is her mother. Hayes told that is not true. Hayes told that the suspect is Sharice brother, who is Jamar Clark.

Hayes told she doesn't know why Jamar did this to her. Hayes told that Jamar shoved her to the ground and said beat, but then stopped describing this. Hayes told when she got up Jamar apologized and stated he thought she was someone else.

Hayes told that when her ankle was injured it happened outside in the hallway of the building on the 1st floor. Hayes told this happen approximately 830. Hayes denied calling the police and someone else called the police.

Hayes told that when she was inside the ambulance that Jamar tried to get inside the ambulance. Hayes told that Jamar never gained access into the ambulance. I asked her what happened when she was in the ambulance and she told that the drove her to the hospital. I asked Hayes if she heard any shots outside of the ambulance and she told me no.

Hayes was asked if she saw Jamar with a weapon and she told me no. I asked her if she ever saw Jamar with

a weapon and she told me no.

Hayes told Jamar grabbed her and he did a leg swipe on her and she fell backwards to the ground. Hayes told Jamar was trying to get her attention in the wrong way. Hayes told that Jamar had head butted her and caused the cut to the inside of her lip that needed stitches. Hayes then showed me the injury/stitches to the inside upper lip.

Hayes told Jamar is a normally a calm person and has never seen him like this in the past.

Hayes told that Sharice, Ronnie Powell, Alfred and Keylondra and the kids would have witnessed Jamar do this to her.

After turning off my audio recorder I was told by Hayes that she suffered a fractured right ankle and she may need surgery.

I took the swabs from the plastic bags and placed the swabs and in envelopes. The swabs were property inventoried.

We then responded to the scene located at 1611 Plymouth Av N. Upon arrival, Sgt. Green briefed us on the incident.

# Scene Summary:

We were informed that HCMC ambulance #419 responded to the area of 1611 Plymouth Av N to render aid to a female assault victim. While doing so, EMS personnel requested police presence, as a male was causing a disturbance, hindering their medical intervention.

Upon arrival of officers, a physical altercation occurred with the male when trying to take him into custody. During the altercation, a shot was fired by a responding officer, striking the male.

Both the female and the male were transported by EMS from the scene.

On the boulevard in front of 1611 Plymouth Av N, a discharged cartridge casing (DCC), set of handcuffs (both cuffs open), and a green EMS bag with medical supplies was observed. An area of blood-like substance (BLS) was also observed on the above mentioned boulevard/sidewalk.

HCMC EMS command vehicle #41035 was parked facing east along the south curb of Plymouth Av N, west of 1611 Plymouth Av N.

Squad 424 (involved officers) was parked facing southeast in the eastbound lane of Plymouth Av N, just east of the above mentioned EMS command vehicle.

Surveillance cameras were observed on the east side of 1614 Plymouth Av N (I.B.P.O. Elks of World). It is unknown if the footage from these cameras captured the incident, as we were not able to view the footage while on scene.

Evidence markers (EMs) A-C were placed by FS N. Lenway next to the DCC, handcuffs and EMS bag.

A secondary search for evidence was conducted and a possible squad key was located near the handcuffs on the boulevard in front of 1611 Plymouth Av N. This was marked with EM: D. Additional photographs and measurements were taken.

- DCC (EM: A) from boulevard in front of 1611 Plymouth Av N
- Handcuffs (EM: B) from boulevard in front of 1611 Plymouth Av N
- Green EMS bag with medical supplies (EM: C) from boulevard in front of 1611 Plymouth Av N
- Possible squad key (EM: D) from boulevard in front of 1611 Plymouth Av N

After collection, an additional search for evidence was conducted with negative results.

After clearing the scene, we responded to the Forensic Garage, where we met a tow truck carrying HCMC ambulance #419. Ambulance #419 was placed inside the Forensic Garage. Sgt. J. Moore also responded, along with a supervisor from HCMC, to the Forensic Garage to view video footage captured on the cameras of the ambulance.

The collected items were brought to the Crime Lab Unit; They were sealed and placed into secured storage for transfer to the BCA.

The photographs, sketch, and video will be retained in the Crime Lab Unit.
