Trustee's Deed and Plat

Individual and testamentary trust deeds require examiner's approval. Minn Stat § <u>508.62</u>. Approval will happen as part of the recording process. Approval is not required for corporate trust deeds. Minn Stat § <u>501C.0102</u>. The Registrar of Titles won't accept a plat executed by a trustee owner unless it has been certified by the Examiner— Minn Stat § <u>508.62</u>. Email our office prior to the plat signing to coordinate the approval.

Required documents:

- **Deed**—Trustee's deed is recommended; UCB Form <u>10.4.1</u> (individual trustee) or UCB Form <u>10.4.3</u> (business entity trustee)
- The Trust Instrument or a Certificate of Trust—UCB Form <u>90.1.1</u> (individual trustee) or UCB Form <u>90.1.2</u> (business entity trustee); (Minn Stat § <u>501C.1013</u>)
- Affidavit of Trustee—UCB Form <u>90.1.3</u> (inter vivos trust) or UCB Form <u>90.1.4</u> (testamentary trust); (Minn Stat § <u>501C.1014</u>)

Before you submit your documents, check to make sure:

- The affidavit is signed and verified the same day or after the deed is dated and executed, whichever is later. Example: deed is dated January 1; deed is acknowledged January 4; the affidavit must be signed January 4 or later.
- Paragraph 3 of the affidavit is filled in with information about the trustee's deed you want to file. The 3 blanks are for the grantor, grantee, and date of the trustee's deed.

General tips

 Proof-read all documents and check that the acknowledgment or verification is complete and in the correct form. See Minn Stat § <u>358.66</u>.
