



## **Work Type Definition: Environmental Property Assessment & Clean-up**

### **I. Minimum Requirements**

Some aspects of this work type require that the work being completed to be under the direct supervision of a Minnesota Professional Engineer in the appropriate discipline, a Minnesota licensed Geologist or by a Minnesota Department of Health certified laboratory.

Environmental property assessment involves the evaluation of property that Hennepin County owns or has an interest in for the presence of contamination and other environmental risks and the development of response actions.

This work type includes the completion of one or more of the services listed below.

- A. Phase I Environmental Site Assessments
- B. Phase II Environmental Site Assessments
- C. Response Action Plans/Construction Contingency Plans
- D. Environmental Oversight Relating to the Implementation of Response Actions
- E. Quality Assurance Project Plans and Sampling and Analysis Plans, as required by federally-funded assessment and cleanup grants
- F. Laboratory services
- G. Tank investigation
- H. Policy analysis and regulatory liaison and reporting services

### **IV. Standards and specifications**

**Standards and specifications required for a project under this work type may include the following:**

- A. U.S. EPA All Appropriate Inquiries & ASTM Practice E 1527-13
- B. Other ASTM standards, as appropriate (e.g. ASTM E2600-10 Vapor Encroachment standard)
- C. Federal and state statutes
- D. Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, Minnesota Department of Transportation and Minnesota Department of Health regulations and guidance documents
- E. Laboratory standards (e.g., Minnesota Department of Health Certified Minnesota Laboratory), where applicable
