



Voting as a college student



Can I vote? Yes, if you are

- A U.S. citizen
- At least 18 years old on Election Day
- A resident of Minnesota for at least 20 days as of Election Day
- Not serving a felony sentence in a correctional facility (incarcerated)
- A judge has not revoked your right to vote under guardianship

Register to vote at mnvotes.gov

- Register to vote with the address you currently consider home
 - For example, your dorm, off-campus housing, or your parents' home
- You can also register on Election Day
 - You will need to bring a valid proof of residence (visit mnvotes.gov for options)

How to vote

Early by mail

Apply to have an absentee ballot mailed to you at hennepin.us/elections

- Voting by mail is convenient since you can specify where you want your ballot mailed to you.
- You can still vote if you are studying abroad!
 1. Go to mnvotes.gov to apply for an UOCAVA absentee ballot to be mailed to you
 2. Receive your ballot, fill it out, and mail it back

or

Early in person

Starts 46 days before Election Day

or

Vote on Election Day

Find your polling place at pollfinder.sos.state.mn.us

- Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
