Trainings offered:

- Office Support
- IT Support
- Medical Office Support
- Solar Panel Installation
- Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Technician
- Construction Pre-Apprentice

Requirements:

- Participants must be eligible to work in the United States, have a government issued photo ID and a Social Security card.
- Participants can live anywhere in Minnesota, however, with in-person classes being close is ideal.
- Participants are committed to their training program.
- Participants can self-pay, have a referring counselor pay for the training or qualify for grant funding. Grant funding is for low-income Minnesota residents who are looking for work.

Avivo

- Participants intend to search for employment, with the assistance of a career counselor, after completion of the training program.
- Eligible students could have their training fees and some support services paid through a grant program. Eligibility for the grant depends on the household income and size. To qualify for the grant, a student's income would need to be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Rate.
- The trainings are conducted in-person.

Construction – Pre-Apprenticeship

- Our construction pre-apprenticeship program is co-taught by female trainers from EMERGE and Fireweed.
- Class includes construction fundamentals, forklift class for exposure to heavy equipment, and hands-on power tools and a shed build project at Fireweed.
- Women focused cohort will be starting in May.

- Business diploma/GED, no felonies, misdemeanors decided on case-by-case
- Financial Henn Co only, diploma/GED, no felonies, misdemeanors decided on case-by-case

Hired

Medical Call Center

- Prepares participants to interface with the public through call center representative and patient scheduler positions in a hospital, clinic, or remote setting.
- Includes customer service skills, healthcare systems terminology, keyboarding and computer skill development, job skills, an 8-hour Mental Health First Aid class and connections to employers.
- Training is free for eligible participants.
- Training is both in-person and online.

Requirements:

- HS Diploma/GED
- Some reading/computer/typing skills
- Clean criminal background check with ability to pass DHS check
- 1 year of recent customer service experience
- Low income household eligibility

Office Administration

- Prepares participants to interface for public sector admin jobs performing clerical and admin functions.
- Includes customer service skills, business communication and professionalism, keyboarding and computer skill development, job skills, de-escalation and problem solving college coursework, and connections to employers.
- Training is free for eligible participants.
- Training is both in-person and online.

- HS Diploma/GED
- 6 months office experience and/or some college
- Typing at least 30 WPM
- Experience with Microsoft Office
- Low income household eligibility

- Be a military veteran
- Have been recently incarcerated
- Are receiving or recently have received public assistance
- No-cost career training for qualified and enrolled students
- Training begins on campus then often moves to remote learning.


