### B.E.S.T Car Seat Training

Each foster parent transporting children under the age of 8 years must complete the Basic Education for Safe Travel (B.E.S.T). This training includes the online Car Seat Basics followed by the in-person car seat check within 30 days after finishing the Car Seat Basics. The car seat checks are held at the Northwest Family Service Center in Brooklyn Center.

- 1. Each foster parent in the home must complete their own Car Seat Basic online training.
- 2. Complete the Car Seat Basic online training https://carseateducation.org/product/car-seat-basics-1
- 3. Once you receive your certificate, email <a href="mailto:fostercare@hennepin.us">fostercare@hennepin.us</a> to register for your Car Seat Check.
- 4. A vehicle is required for the Car Seat Check. If you are a relative provider without access to a vehicle, speak with your licensing worker as they will need to register you for the training.
