Car Seat Training

Each foster parent transporting children under the age of 8 years must complete the Basic Education for Safe Travel (B.E.S.T). This training includes the online Car Seat Basics followed by the in-person car seat check within 30 days after finishing the Car Seat Basics. The car seat checks are held at the Northwest Family Service Center in Brooklyn Center.

- 1. Each foster parent in the home must complete their own Car Seat Basic online training
- 2. Complete the Car Seat Basic online training https://carseateducation.org/product/car-seat-basics-1
- 3. Once you receive your certificate, email fostercare@hennepin.us to register for your Car Seat Check.
- 4. You must bring a vehicle, and the foster child if currently in your home, and using a car seat with you.
- 5. If you are unable to attend the upcoming dates you can find a list of B.E.S.T approved facilitators here https://buckleupmn.org/best-locator/. You will be charged a fee by these B.E.S.T Facilitators.

Registration for the Car Seat Checks are open only to Foster Parents with Hennepin County Foster Care and private/counties agencies with children placed by Hennepin County that use car seats during transportation
