





MIDTOWN GREENWAY CONNECTION

The new trail will provide an accessible connection to the Midtown Greenway while keeping 95% of the Soo Line Community Garden intact.






8-foot-wide trail along north edge of garden






Concept B

GARFIELD AVENUE






8-foot-wide trail adjacent to alley






Concept B

CONSTRUCTION TECHNIQUES

- Use smaller scale construction equipment to minimize garden impacts
- Use the maintenance road and alley areas for material delivery
- Consider alternative paving materials
- Consider growing and nesting seasons in techniques and timing

Project reviewed for environmental impacts:

The project will:

- Avoid application of herbicides, insecticides and fungicides
- Provide more than 2,000 square feet of new pollinator plantings
