Asset Management Dashboard 2023

System condition: Fair to good

Assets in Hennepin County's transportation system are divided into five groups for analyzing, reporting and programming. The 2023 performance targets and measures for all five asset groups are listed below.

Overall, the health of our system remains fair to good, but is declining. The system is aging (41% of roads are more than 50 years old) and deterioration rates are increasing. Timely and effective preservation and maintenance continue to be needed to maintain reasonable service life.

Roadway pavement: Not meeting targets

Pavement conditions have been declining for the last five years and are currently 245 lane miles short of meeting the ride quality (PSR) target.
