Community engagement

- Continue building cross-departmental collaboration, culturally specific outreach, and relationships
- Share information and resources with community related to opioids, climate action, and more
- Engaged 50+ on American Indian resident experience community needs assessment



Climate action

- 70,540 square feet of land converted into urban agriculture.
- Training and educating 27,440 residents on clean energy, climate preparedness, and extreme heat.
- 760kW of rooftop solar in community sites, and 1,072 residents installing solar at home.



Education

- Holistic, multigenerational services
- 2,100 students served, 87% people of color
- Align resources and increase efficiencies through Grow, Learn, Thrive framework



Challenges and opportunities

Challenge

Cuts to state and federally funded programs
(State's Dislocated Worker, WIOA and SNAP E&T)

Opportunity

Leaning into the federated mode inventory of countywide workforce development efforts

Challenge

Ongoing gaps in affordable broadband infrastructure, federal grants canceled from Digital Equity act programs

Opportunity

BDI is using a coordinated approach to partnerships that inform community on emerging technologies
