


Homelessness and housing milestones

27% of households pay more than 30% of their income for housing


They are at risk of being unable to afford to meet other basic needs:

Cost-burdened households by income range




- Households without cost burden
- Households with housing cost burden (housing costs 30-50% of income)
- Households with severe housing cost burden (housing costs > 50% of income)

Untenable housing costs disproportionately harm households of color.


Housing cost-burden by race / ethnicity





2023 accomplishments

Homelessness response

- 9,800+ nightly stays in emergency shelter
- 2,171 exits from homelessness to permanent housing
- 15,000+ served in supportive housing programs

Affordable housing

- \$22 million invested in affordable and low-barrier housing
- 2 motels fully converted to singleroom occupancy housing
- Down payment assistance program launched to address systemic barriers to homeownership

Homelessness is unacceptable


Nobody should be without the safety, security and dignity of a home.

Our committed and collaborative efforts have shown we are capable of mobilizing resources to help keep people in their homes or help them find and sustain new homes.




Homelessness in Hennepin County, 2023



Help people access community-based resources as alternatives to shelter

Hennepin Shelter Hotline

1 in 4

households diverted from shelter every week





Improve emergency shelter

Single adults 18+

- Investing in 24/7 shelter options
- Completing capital improvements at shelters to increase safety and dignity
- Bringing new shelters online
- Focusing on specialty subpopulations

Families with children

- Eliminating self-pay
- Maintaining shelter-all practice for families despite unprecedented demand
- Keeping real-time data and by-name list
- Increasing services and staffing to be responsive to cultural needs and trends





Help people, wherever they are

Streets to Housing team

- Initial contact with people experiencing unsheltered homelessness
- Help meeting basic needs
- Connection to housing case management





Optimize Coordinated Entry

In 2023, we collaborated on making stronger housing referrals:

- 150 projects/ 50+ providers seeking referrals
- 2,235 referrals made during our improvement project

Resulting achievements

- 3,284 households added to priority list
- 0.28 days to referral (families)
- 1.12 days to referral (singles)





Reach 'Functional zero' housing milestones

Today: 94 veterans are homeless

Since January 2023: 321 veterans housed Goal: End of 2024


Today: 313 households are chronically homeless

Since January 2018

1,759 housed from chronic list

95% retention rate

Goal: End of 2025



Provide personcentered, housingfocused case management

County staff and community partners helped house **2,171** people from shelter and unsheltered settings in 2023.

Partner to increase supportive housing opportunities for people exiting homelessness

538

new opportunities for people who exit from homelessness in 2023

- 43% site-based
- 33% scattered site
- 24% rapid rehousing



Seek reforms and alternatives in the Housing Support program



Housing Support ('GRH' reform)

Rent = 30% income

This will benefit 2,000+ households in permanent supportive housing

Reducing operating costs of affordable housing through deferred loans, deed restrictions





Data-driven approach

- Responding to data and people with lived experience of homelessness, housing instability
- Setting aside units for people at greatest health and safety risks when unhoused

Impacts of innovation

- 83 units of Single Room
 Occupancy Housing
- 575 Supportive Housing units financed




Affordable housing

Affordable housing pipeline production

- Strategic and reliable
- In 2023, Affordable Housing Investment Fund financed 10,000th unit

Affordable housing

Accelerating housing production

- Provided high-powered awards to projects rebuilding neighborhoods and affordable housing ecosystem
- Expedited development of 1,200 units







Affordable home ownership

- Access: Homebuyer assistance




Affordable housing operating model

Rental subsidies cover the remaining gap






Pandemic-era challenges



Unprecedented growth in investment continues





In the next 5 years we can:

- Create 5,000 new housing opportunities
- Preserve 3,000 homes
- Provide financial assistance to help 15,000 households avoid eviction
- Divert 6,500 households from needing shelter
- Move 10,000 people from homelessness to housing
