Total Out of Home Placements


Figure 1¹ shows the breakout of out of home placements. Overall, there were 187 out of home placements in quarter four of 2017. Twenty-eight percent were HC Placements, 61% were greater Minnesota placements and 11% percent were out of state placements.




Closed Placements


Figure 2² shows the breakout of closed out of home placements. Of the 187 total placements, 46 closed during quarter four of 2017.

Thirty percent were HC Placements, 65% were greater Minnesota placements and 5% were out of state placements.


Open Placements

There were 141 youth in placement on the last day of the quarter (December 31, 2017).




Figure 3. Open Out of Home Placements Q4 2017

Twenty-eight percent were youth in Hennepin County, 59% were youth in greater Minnesota placements and 13% were in an out of sate placement (see Figure 3).

Most youth in Hennepin County on December 31st were at the CHS (62%). Slightly more than 8 in 10 (81%) youth placed in greater Minnesota were in RTC, as were slightly more than three-quarters (79%) of youth placed outside of Minnesota.





The chart below shows the number of male and female youth in out of home placement on the last day of the quarter (December 31, 2017).

About this Report

The Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation has been tracking Correctional Outof-Home Placements (COHP) for juvenile offenders since 2009. This report describes youth who were in out of home placement during the fourth quarter of 2017.

This report provides a breakdown of the youth in open and closed placements. Placements open on the last day of the quarter (i.e., December 31, 2017) are broken out by race and gender. Average length of stay is broken out by race and reported for closed placements. Placement Type is classified in several ways. Overall, placements are organized by Hennepin County (HC), Greater Minnesota (MN), and Out of State (OS). Within those categories, placements are broken out by Residential Treatment Center (RTC) placements, Sex Offender (SO) placements County Home School (CHS-HC only) placements, and other placements. Other placements include: Foster Homes, Shelters, Transition, Group Homes and Evaluation.

Data is pulled 45 days after each quarter ends from the juvenile case management information system (MAIn) using the COHP Population Report.
