

Out-of-Home Placement & Screening Trends Q2 2018

Total Out of Home Placements

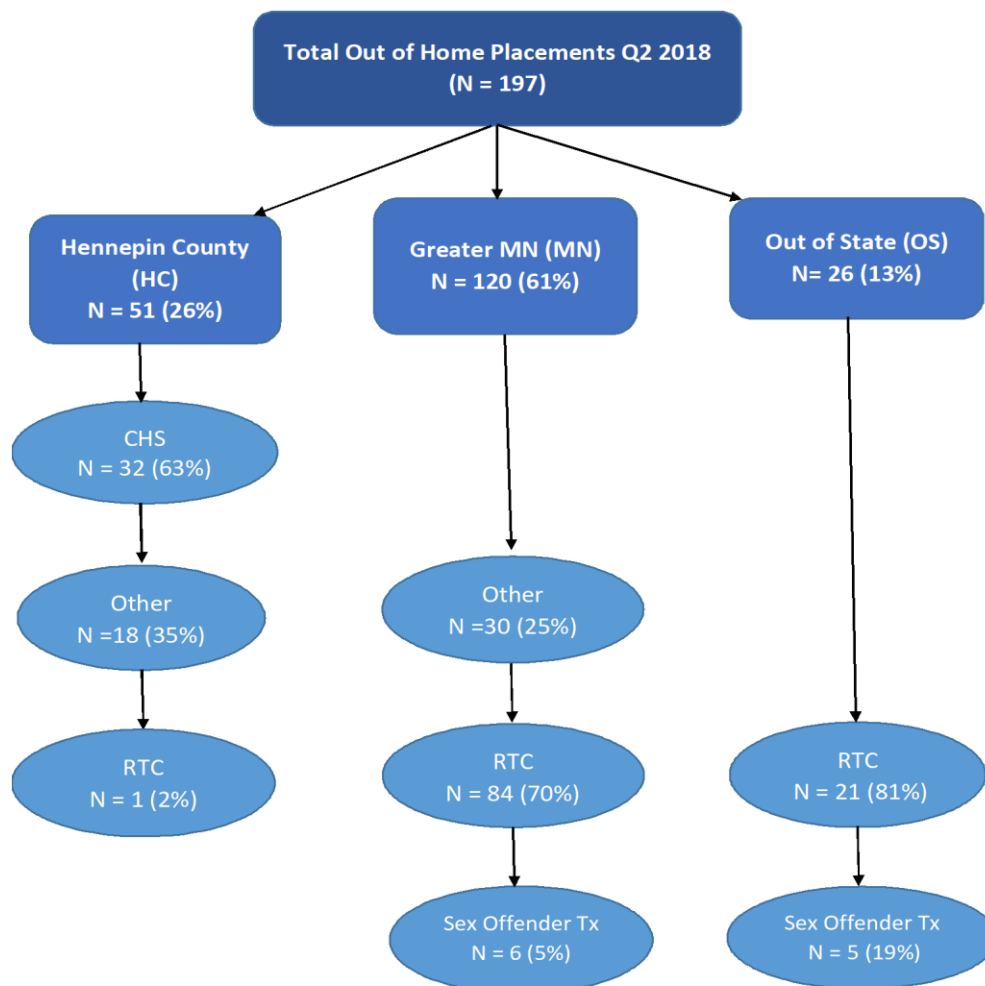
Figure 1¹ shows the breakout of out of home placements. Overall, there were 197 out of home placements in quarter two of 2018. Twenty-six percent were Hennepin County placements, 61% were Greater Minnesota placements, and 13% were out of state placements.

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Figure 1. Total Out of Home Placements Q2 2018



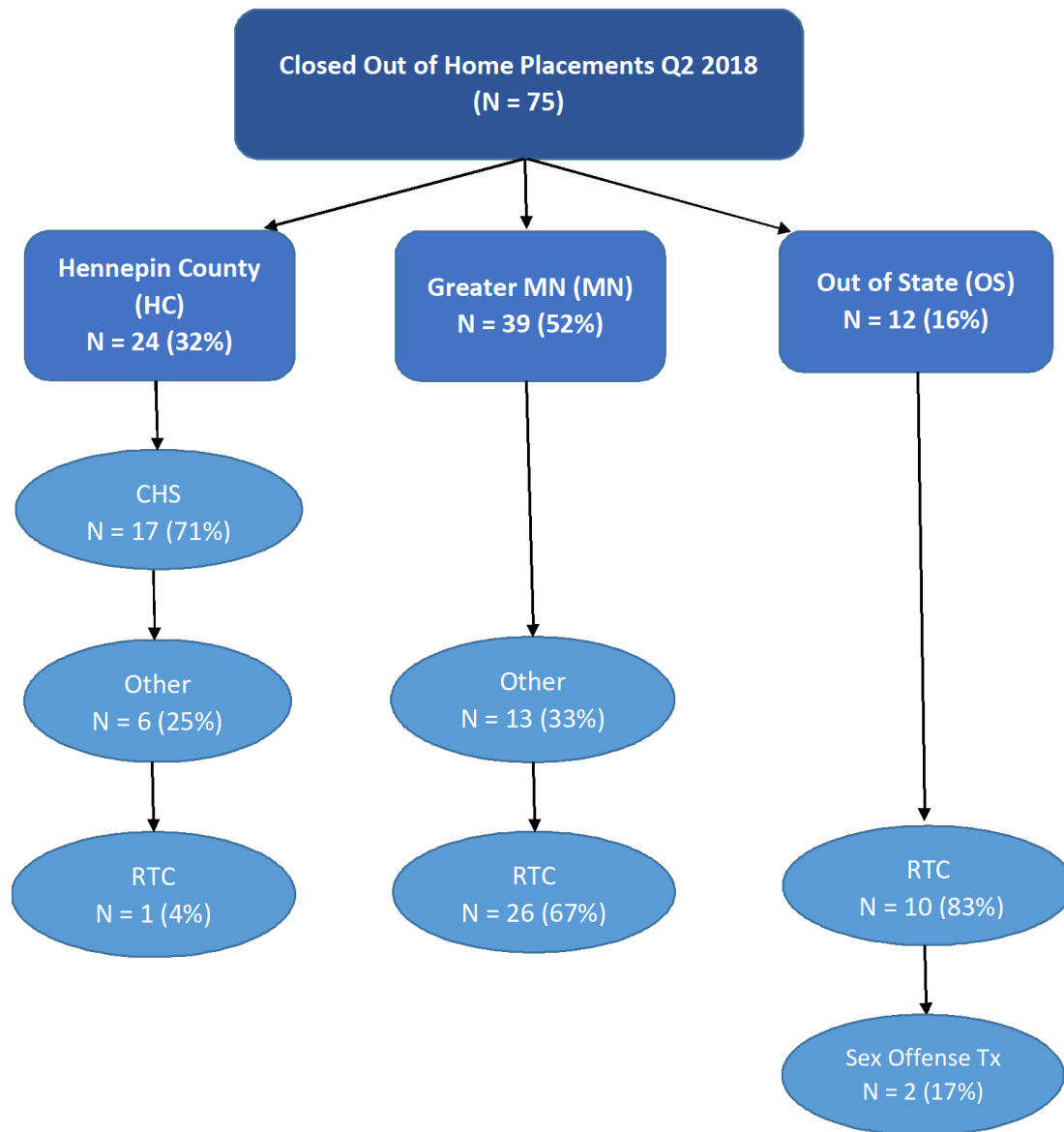

Closed Placements

Figure 2² shows the breakout of closed out of home placements (those which ended). Of the 197 total placements, 75 closed during quarter two of 2018.

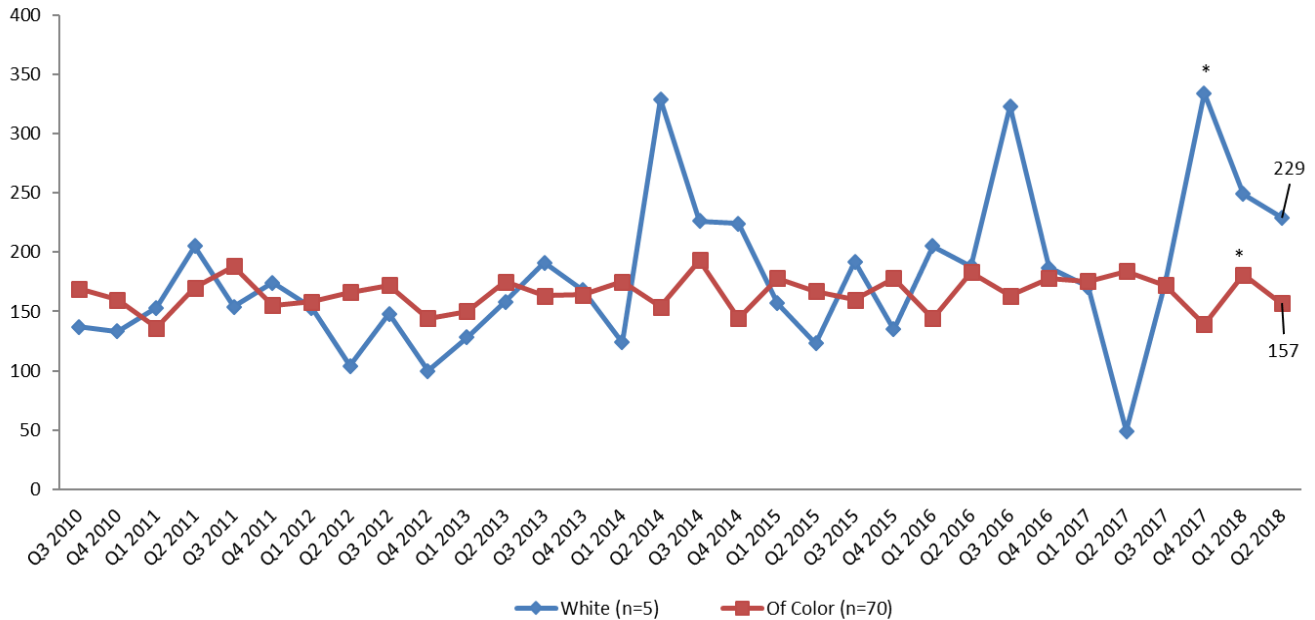
Thirty-two percent were HC placements, 52% were Greater Minnesota placements and 16% were out of state placements.

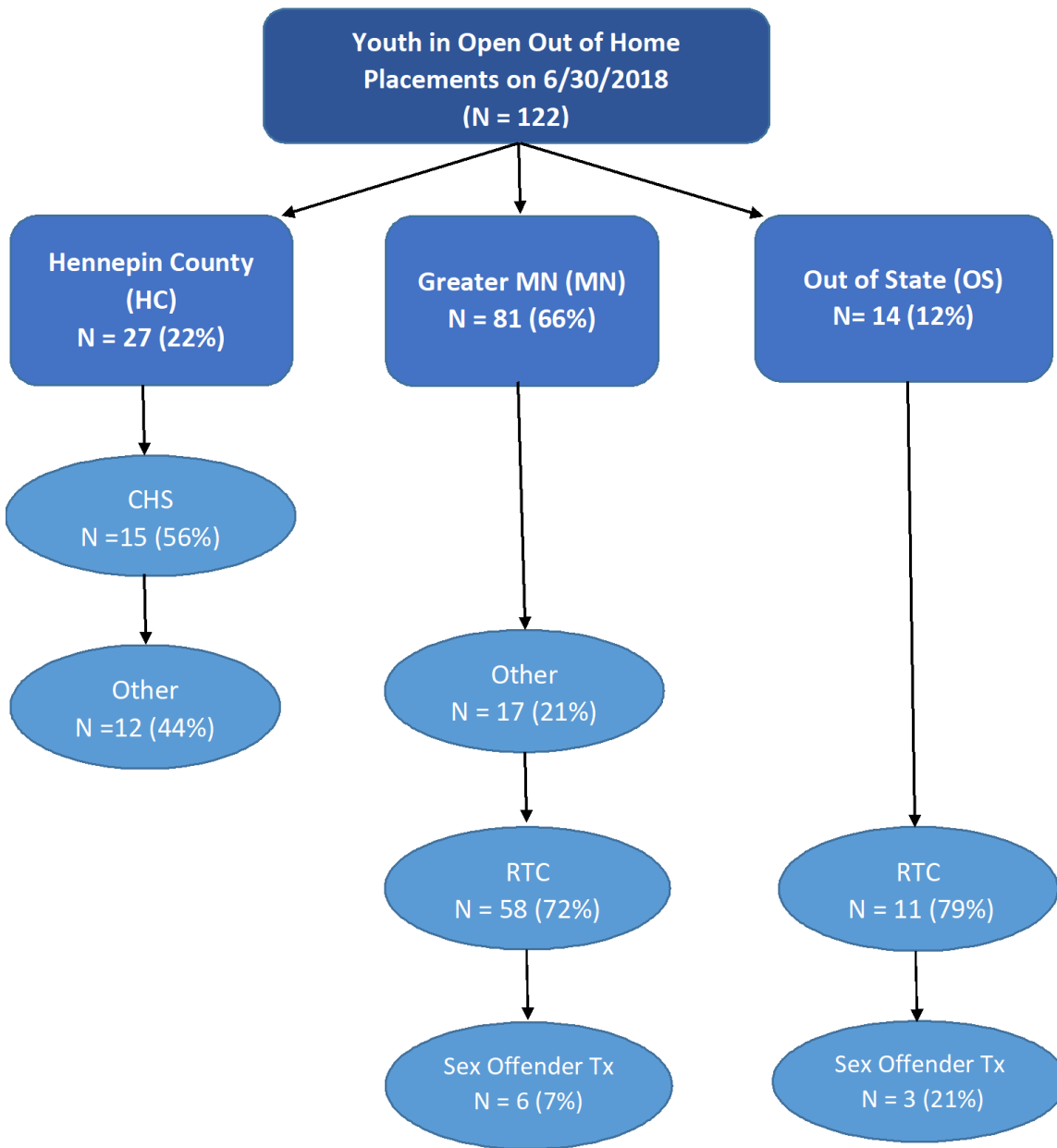
Open Placements

There were 122 youth in placement on the last day of the quarter (June 30, 2018).

Twenty-two percent were youth in Hennepin County, 66% were youth in Greater Minnesota placements and 12% were in an out of state placement (see Figure 3).

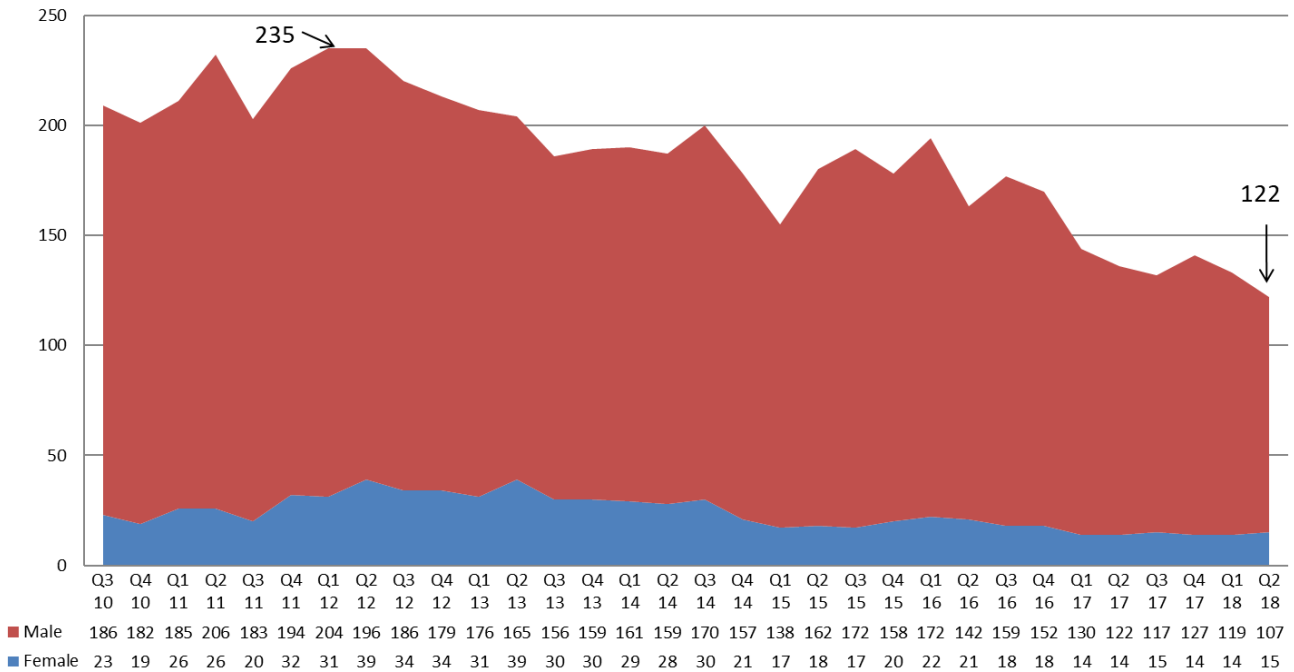
A majority of youth in Hennepin County on June 30th were at the CHS (56%). Roughly 7 in 10 (72%) youth placed in Greater Minnesota were in an RTC, as were slightly more than three-quarters (79%) of youth placed outside of Minnesota.

Figure 3. Open Out of Home Placements Q2 2018



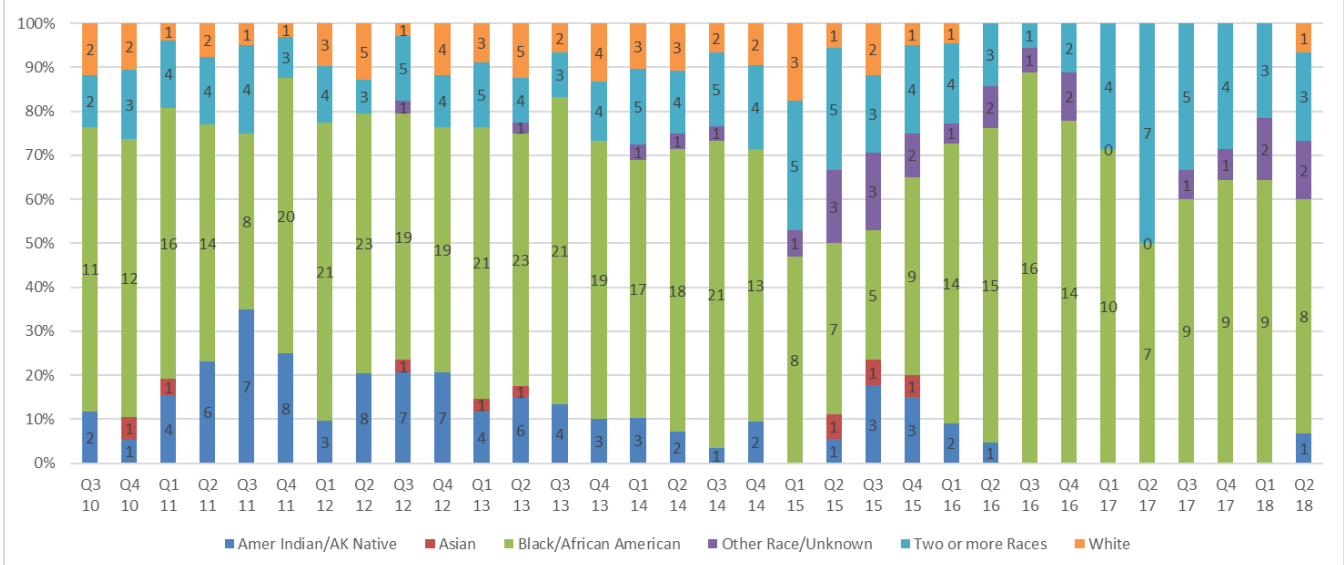
The chart below shows the number of male and female youth in out of home placement on the last day of the quarter (June 30, 2018).

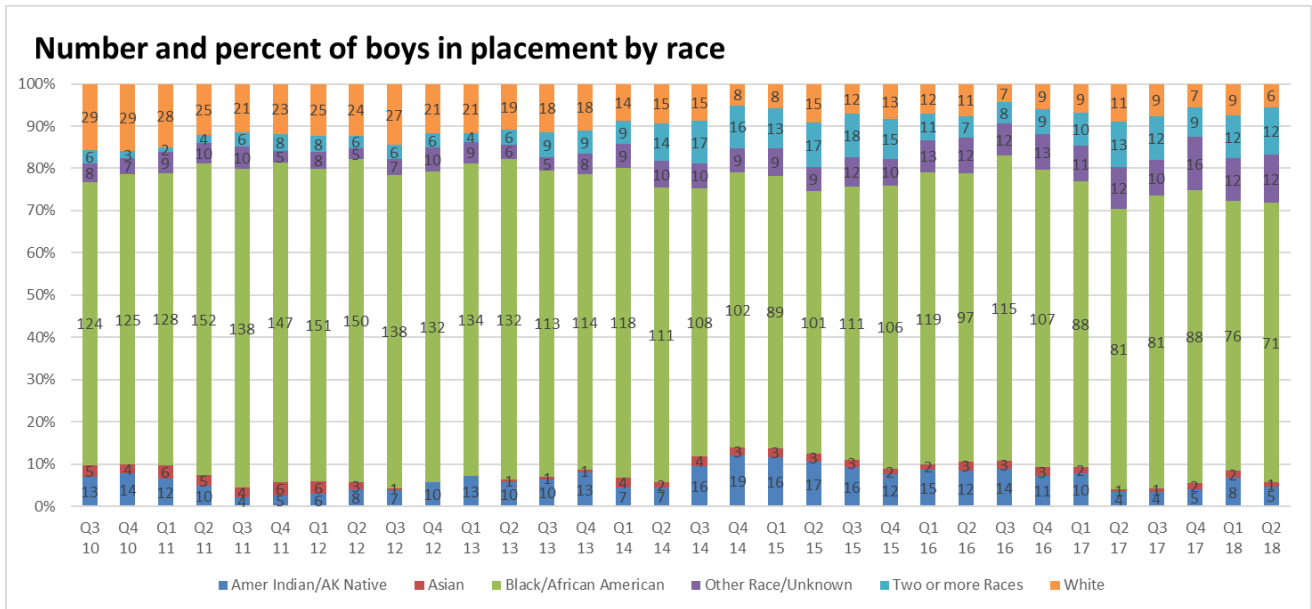
Youth in out-of-home placement at quarter end by sex

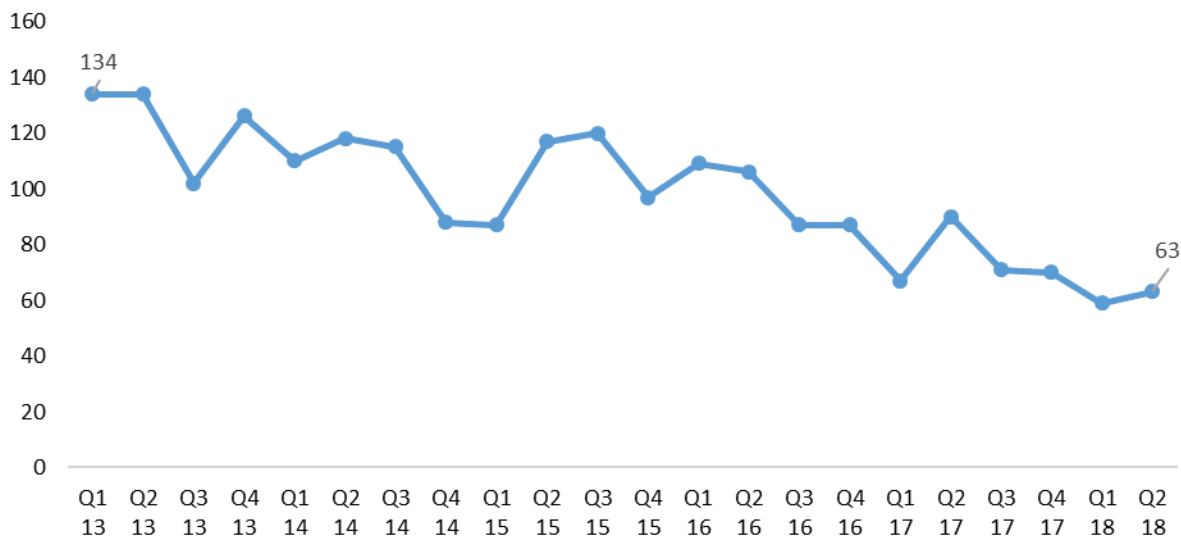

Screening

Youth receive a placement screening to determine if an out-of-home placement is recommended³. The chart below shows the number of placement screenings conducted on youth by quarter. There was a 52% decrease in screenings between Q1 2013 and Q2 2018. Youth who are sent directly to placement as a court order are not included in the chart.

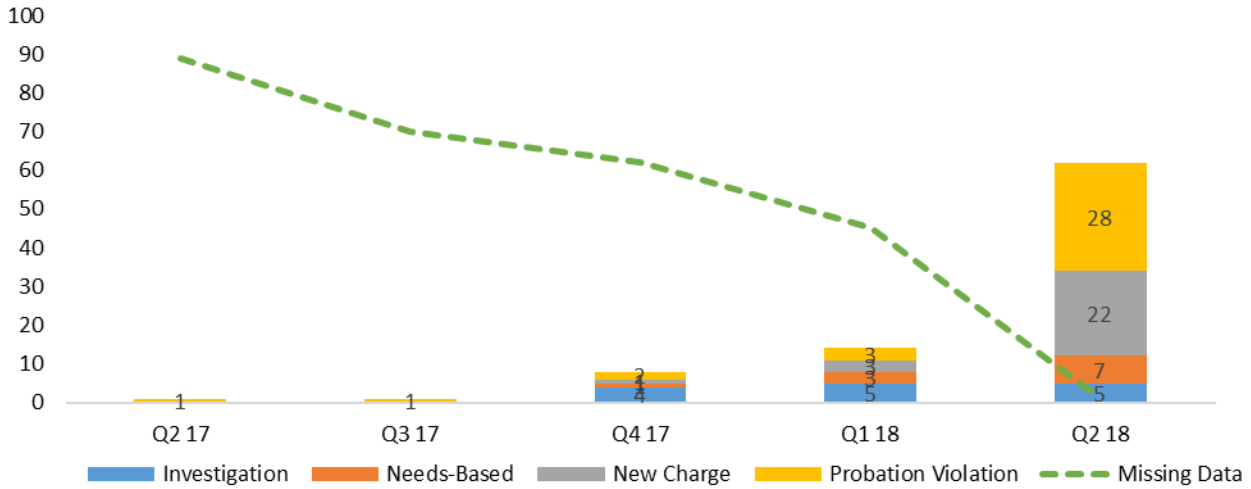
Number of placement screenings



Placement screenings are conducted for a number of different reasons. Staff began recording the reason for conducting a placement screening in April 2017, though it was infrequently recorded during the first year of data collection (as seen in the chart below). In Q2 2018, the reason for screening was "probation violation" for 28 (44%), "new charge" for 22 (35%), "needs-based" for seven (11%), "investigation" for five (8%), and missing data for 1 (2%).

³ At times a youth may be screened for more than one placement on a single day. These records have been counted as duplicates and have been removed for analysis.

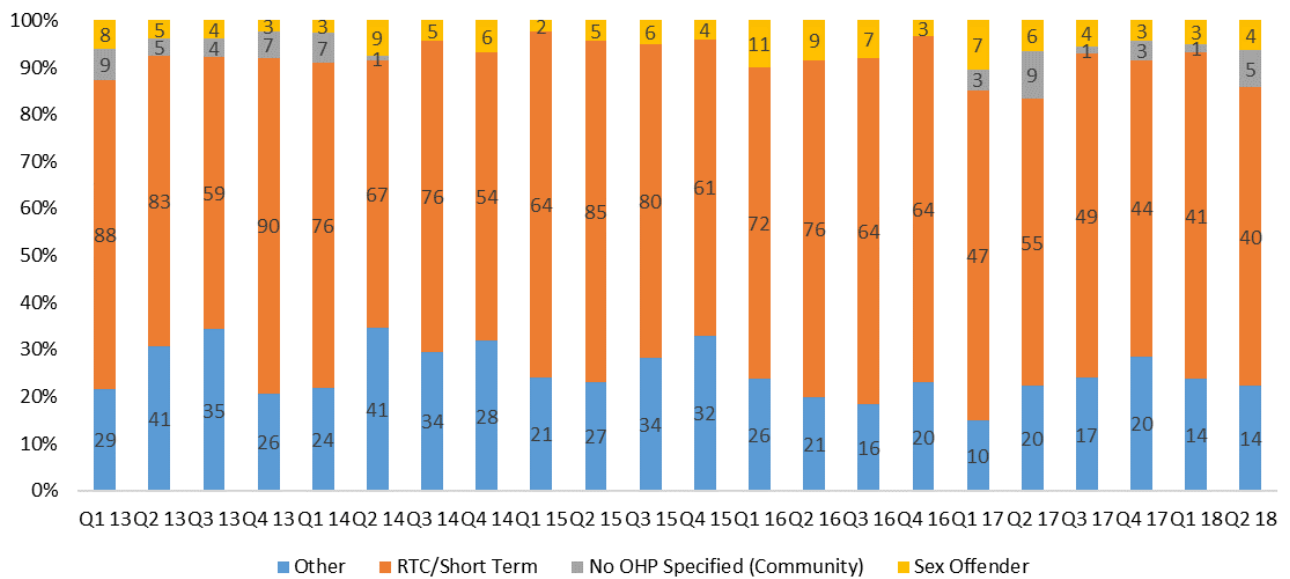
Reason for placement screening



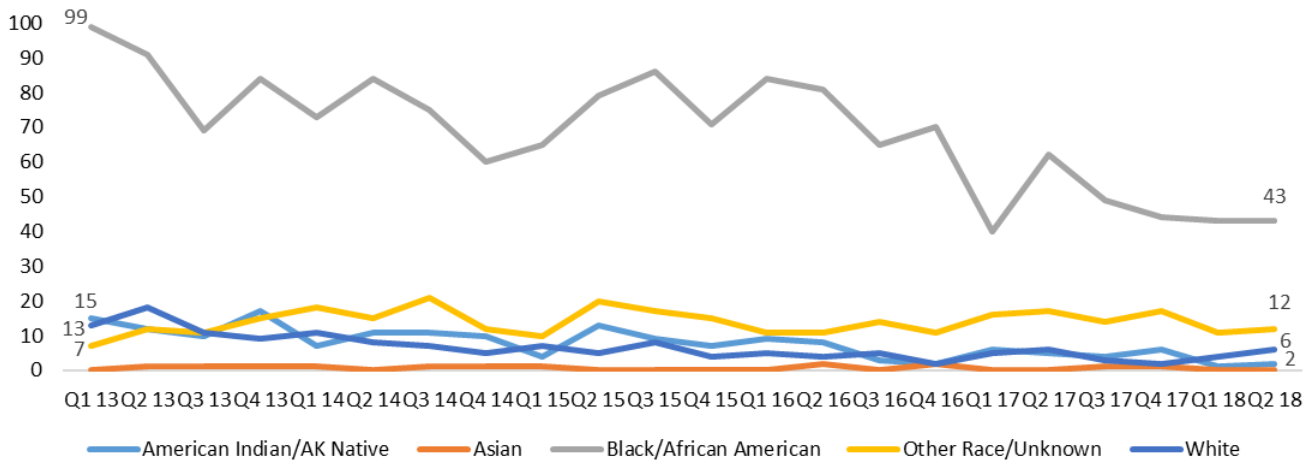
*Reason for placement screening was not captured prior to April 2017.

The following charts show placement screenings by type and by race. Here, the "Other" category includes Foster Homes, Group Homes, Shelters, Transition, Chemical Dependency, Mental Health and Evaluation. In some cases, the screening committee does not recommend an out-of-home placement and instead recommends a community-based service, indicated in the chart as "No OHP Specified (Community)".

Placement screenings by race



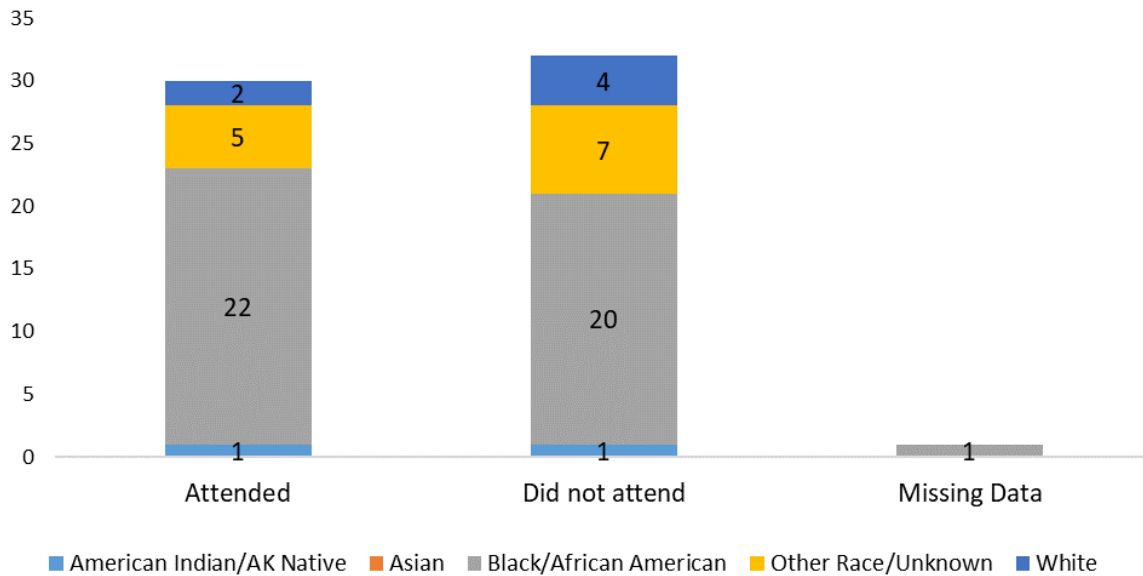
The following table shows the breakdown of screening type by race. The percentages in the table display the percent of one racial group screened for the placement type. For example, 23% of youth of color were screened for “Other” placement type in Q1 2018, compared to 17% of white youth.

Staff began recording parental attendance at placement screenings in April 2018. In Q2 2018, parents were in attendance at 48% (N=30) of placement screenings. The chart below shows parental attendance by client race.

About this Report

The Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation has been tracking Correctional Out-of-Home Placements (COHP) for juvenile offenders since 2009. This report describes youth who were in out of home placement during the second quarter of 2018.

This report provides a breakdown of the youth in open and closed placements. Placements open on the last day of the quarter (i.e., June 30, 2018) are broken out by race and gender. Average length of stay is broken out by race and reported for closed placements. Placement Type is classified in several ways. Overall, placements are organized by Hennepin County (HC), Greater Minnesota (MN), and Out of State (OS). Within those categories, placements are broken out by Residential Treatment Center (RTC) placements, Sex Offender (SO) placements, County Home School (CHS- HC only) placements, and other placements. Other placements include: Foster Homes, Shelters, Transition, Group Homes and Evaluation. Placement screening types are similarly broken out by RTC placements, Sex Offender placements, Community-Based placements and other placements. Other placements include: Foster Homes, Shelters, Transition, Group Homes and Evaluation.

Data is pulled 45 days after each quarter ends from the juvenile case management information system (MAIn) using the COHP Population Report.
