What is MSS?

- One of the longest-running youth surveys in the nation
- Conducted every 3 years since 1989
- Primary source of youth data for the state, county and local level
- Local schools and 4 state agencies: Education, Health, Human Services, and Public Safety





Why does MSS matter?

- Provides insight into the experiences of youth
- Only consistent source of statewide data on the well-being of youth
- Helpful tool for schools, communities, county/state agencies, and others





How is MSS administered?

- Census-like survey where all schools are invited to participate
- Voluntary to school districts and students
- Anonymous
- Includes students in grades 5, 8, 9, & 11
 - 3 survey levels depending on student age
- Administered online in recent years

Only asked to students in grades 8, 9, and 11







LGBQ+ youth report high risk of depression at different rates


Percent of students with high risk of depression by sexual orientation





Gender expansive youth report high risk of depression at different rates


Percent of students with high risk of depression by gender identity

MSS 2022 used the Generalized Anxiety Disorder 2-item (GAD-2) to measure high risk of anxiety













Bullying is defined as being targeted by other students at school at least once in the last 30 days. It includes being pushed, shoved, slapped, hit, or kicked non-jokingly; threatened with physical harm; the target of mean rumors or lies; the target of sexual jokes, comments, or gestures; and excluded from friends, other students, or activities.













MSS 2022 Hennepin County students in grades 8, 9, and 11 Illicit drug use or prescription drug misuse is defined as using illicit drugs (such as cocaine, heroin, synthetic marijuana, etc.), using over-the-counter drugs only to get high, or using prescription drugs without a doctor's prescription or differently from how a doctor told you to use it on at least one occasion in the last 12 months.



Summary of Key Health Indicators for LGBTQ+ Youth



Compared to non-LGBTQ+ youth, LGBTQ+ youth report:



Higher rates of high risk of depression or anxiety



Higher rates of selfharm and suicide ideation or attempts



Higher rates of bullying and discrimination



Higher rates of feeling unsafe



Higher rates of substance use






LGBTQ+ youth of different races and ethnicities report high risk of depression at **different** rates




LGBTQ+ youth of different ethnic groups report high risk of depression at **different** rates

Measure: Adverse childhood experiences



LGBTQ+ youth with more ACEs report high risk of depression at **higher** rates than those with fewer ACEs

MSS 2022 Hennepin County students in grades 8, 9, and 11 High risk of depression is defined as scoring a three or higher (out of six) on the Patient Health Questionnaire-2 (PHQ-2), which measures the frequency of a depressed mood or anhedonia over the past two weeks.

Adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) are defined as potentially traumatic experiences that occur in childhood (i.e., before age 18). They include experiences such as living with someone who uses illicit drugs, being physically hurt by parents or other adults in your home or having parents or guardians who have ever been in jail or prison.



Key takeaways
