

LCA TOD Program Description

- Funding allocation
- Program Purpose
- Definition of TOD
 - Transit-Oriented Development is defined as residential and commercial centers designed to maximize access by transit and non-motorized transportation, and with other features to encourage transit ridership. A TOD neighborhood has a center with a rail or bus station, surrounded by relatively high-density development, with progressively lower-density spreading outwards.



Process Overview


- Applications were due February 15
- Staff review and evaluation February through April
- Staff recommended funding to CDC April 16
- CDC recommended funding to full Council April 25

Linden Yards West


- City of Minneapolis
- **Recommended:** \$100,000 LCDA

• Funded items:

- Update building program and development plan
- Investigate geothermal
- Stormwater planning

Comments:

- Updated development plan could help realize a highimpact TOD project next to Southwest LRT's Van White Station by ensuring that the planned infrastructure is well coordinated and designed to serve both transportation and development goals
- Potential for 1.5 million sq. ft. of office and over 500 units of housing.




Walker-Lake LRT Area

- City of St. Louis Park
- **Recommended:** \$40,000 LCDA
- Funded items:
 - Site-specific surface water management plan

Comments:

- The project will be catalytic for redevelopment of the identified parcels in the TOD station area.
- A coordinated plan will allow the city to make appropriate investments to ensure future development meets TOD goals.



8th Avenue Corridor


- City of Hopkins

 \$900,000 LCDA
 <u>137,000</u> TBRA
 \$1,037,000 Total

• Funded items:

- Site assessment
- Asbestos abatement
- Soil remediation and monitoring
- Design/engineering
- Site acquisition
- Geotechnical

Comments:

• This project will act as a gateway, connecting the station into a built environment with good potential for pedestrians to utilize the connection




Opus Phase II Systems Analysis

- **Recommended:** \$45,000 LCDA
- Funded items:
 - Stormwater analysis

2011 Potential Expected LCA TOD Outcomes

\$15.4 million in LCA TOD funds potentially will:

- Leverage \$240 million private investment
- Leverage \$32 million Other public investment
- Add 1,000 construction and 1,000 full and part-time jobs
- Add 1,246 total housing units
- Add 653 affordable housing units
- Increase taxable market value by nearly \$400 million
